The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, January 3, 2023 at the White County Courthouse. Members of Committee A, for 2022/2023 include, White County Commissioners T.K. Austin, Cain Rogers, Becky Golden, Lanny Selby, Thomas Margeson, Derrick Hutchings, and Larry Daniels.

#### Agenda item #1 - #3; Call to Order - Roll Call - Prayer:

Chairman Austin called the meeting of White County Steering A to order and requested roll call of members present. K. England, Recorder called the roll of members in attendance. Members present were Commissioners Cain Rogers, Lanny Selby, Thomas Margeson, Becky Golden, Derrick Hutchings and Lanny Selby and Larry Daniels. Also present were Executive Denny Wayne Robinson, Chad Marcum, WC Finance Director, Commissioner Kyle Goff and several White Co. citizens.

There being a quorum present, Chairman Austin welcomed everyone, followed by opening prayer, led by Commissioner Lanny Selby.

England noted corrections to the Agenda prior to items being discussed. Corrections noted were the day/dates listed incorrectly on the Agenda. Corrections made included,

#### Agenda item # 4 - Approval of Report from December 5, 2022 Steering A meeting.

Chairman Austin asked for review and approval of the Report from the 12/05/2022 Steering A meeting. Commissioner Lanny Selby made a motion to approve the Report as presented, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Derrick Hutchings; without opposition, the motion was approved.

## Agenda item #5 - Discussion on Parks & Rec Joint Program with the City of Sparta

Commissioner Hutchings stated that he had been asked if the county had plans to join efforts with the City of Sparta in the development of a Park and Recreational board, or on P&R projects in the future. Executive Robinson and other members of the Committee stated that they had not been addressed or received requests from the City to be included in any joint efforts, but none are opposed to working with the City of Sparta if or when the need arises. Commissioner Rogers reminded members that the discussion for a county P&R employee was tabled until after the 2023-2024 budget was approved. Additionally, Rogers mentioned that if approved by Budget, the county P&R employee would be tasked with communicating with the City of Sparta and joining efforts on projects whenever possible. Commissioner Kyle Goff, CEO of Sparta-White County YMCA explained that he had recently been asked to serve on the City of Sparta Public Works/P&R committee and would be happy to serve as a liaison between the county and city and keep members informed on ways the county may help. Commissioner Hutchings made a motion to appoint Commissioner Kyle Goff as the official liaison

between the City of Sparta and White County on Park & Rec matters, motion was seconded by Thomas Margeson, with none opposed the motion was approved.

#### Agenda item # 6- Old Business:

Chairman Austin opened the floor for Old Business, however, none was brought forth.

#### Agenda item #7 New Business

Chairman Austin opened the floor for New Business. Executive Robinson announced that the Election Commission confirmed Tuesday, March 14th for citizens of White County to vote yea or nay on the White County Sales Tax Referendum. He further stated that approval of the official ballot must be done by the State of TN Election Office. Robinson reminded everyone that this would be for voters of White County who live <u>outside</u> of the city limits of Sparta. Citizens within the city limits will not be eligible to vote. *Early voting* for the special called election will begin Wednesday, February 22, 2023 through Thursday, March 9, 2023. Additionally, Robinson stated that zero (\$0) county tax dollars is allowed to be spent on advertising or promoting for or against the matter.

Commissioner Hutchings asked Chad Marcum to briefly explain how, if passed, the county sales tax increase would benefit the county. Hutchings further stressed that this tax increase is only being considered to match what is already being paid within the city of Sparta. Marcum explained that increasing the rate from 2.25% to 2.75 % would equate to approximately \$47,200 in NEW revenues county-wide. Other members in attendance stated that the large majority of citizens of White County are paying the increased amount when shopping anywhere inside the City of Sparta, therefore, the overall message for the Sales Tax Referendum is merely a vote to match the City of Sparta's sales tax rate county-wide.

The White County Budget Committee met on Tuesday, January 3, 2023 following Steering Committee A at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Kyle Goff, Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson, Mr. TK Austin, and Mr. Robert McCormick. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum, Ms. Connie Davis, Mr. Joe Hallums, Ms. Becky Golden, and Mr. Chris Brewington. Absent was Mr. Dakota White.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Robinson.

Mr. Robinson asked for approval of the minutes from the December 5, 2022 meeting. Mr. McCormick made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered three (3) General Fund amendments as follows:

- 1. Jail \$9,776 for a training equipment grant from the Tennessee Corrections Institute
- 2. Sheriff's Department \$209,250 for a Federal COPS De-Escalation grant
- 3. Election Commission \$29,750 for estimated costs of Special Election

Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered two (2) General Purpose School Fund amendments as follows:

- 1. WCHS Bleachers \$24,300 additional cost for replacement of reserved seating in gym
- 2. Bookmobile \$25,500 for the purchase of a vehicle to serve as a mobile library

Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. Goff seconded the motion to approve the budget amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission, contingent upon school board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a School Federal Projects Fund amendment in the amount of \$3,500 to correct coding for evaluation and testing in the ARP IDEA, Part B Grant – Subfund 905. Mr. McCormick made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Robinson asked the committee for any old business:

Mr. Robinson brought forward a proposal to adjust the pay for mechanics in the Central Maintenance Department to better align with mechanics in other county operated departments. The proposal would require appropriating an additional \$7,460 dollars toward central maintenance for the remainder of the fiscal year. WHEREAS, White County conducted a formal request for proposals process in October 2016, which resulted in AMB – Ambulance Medical Billing being selected as the most qualified and advantageous proposer for third-party billing services, AND

WHEREAS, on November 21, 2016 the White County Legislative Body granted authorization for the County Executive to execute a contractual agreement with AMB for third-party EMS billing services with an effective date of January 1, 2017, AND

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2020 the White County Legislative Body granted authorization for the County Executive to execute an addendum to the original contract with AMB extending the contract term an additional three (3) years, AND

WHEREAS, White County finds it advantageous to formally acknowledge and execute another renewal addendum to the original contact with AMB which had an effective date of January 1, 2017, AND
