Agenda item # 5 – Speed Limit Reduction on Franchers Mill Rd:

A request to reduce the speed limit from 45mph to 35mph for the entire length of Franchers Mill Rd. was brought before members of Steering A Committee by Commissioner Kyle Goff on behalf of his constituents in Dist #7 of White Co. Goff stated that he recently spoke with Road Superintendent, Jerry Sawyer who had gone to assess the condition and risk hazards on Franchers Mill Rd. A request was made by Goff that a 35mph speed limit be approved for the entire length of the road. The White County Budget Committee met on Monday, April 3, 2023 following Steering Committee A at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Kyle Goff, Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson, Mr. TK Austin, Mr. Dakota White, and Mr. Robert McCormick. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum, Mr. Chris Brewington, Mr. Cain Rogers, Mr. Lanny Selby, Ms. Becky Golden, Mr. Jordan Cocke, Sheriff Steve Page, Mr. Mike Kerr, Mr. Matt McBride, and several members of the White County Sheriff and EMS Departments.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Robinson.

Mr. Robinson asked for approval of the minutes from the March 20, 2023 meeting. Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund amendment in the amount of \$13,113 to appropriate a "Safety Grant" received from Tennessee Risk Management Trust to benefit the Sheriff, Highway, and Solid Waste Departments. Mr. White made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered two (2) General Purpose School Fund amendments as follows:

1. Safe Schools - \$31,449.54 reallocation for security improvements
2. Innovative School Model (ISM) - \$1,500,000 for CTE program support and expansion

Mr. McCormick made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission, contingent upon school board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered seven (7) School Federal Projects Fund amendments as follows:

1. Title II: Subfund 201 - \$300.00 reallocation for salaries
2. Title IV: Subfund 411 - \$627.11 reallocation for purchase of calculators
3. OST Career Pathways: Subfund 951 - \$259.41 reallocation for supplies
4. IDEA, Part B: Subfund 901 - \$45,980.00 reallocation for summer school program
5. OST Career Pathways: Subfund 915 - \$15,000.00 additional appropriation
6. ELC Grant: Subfund 940 - \$190,326.62 additional appropriation
7. ATSI School Improvement: Subfund 171 - \$3,365.96 reallocation for computer purchases

Mr. White made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented, contingent upon school board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Robinson recognized Veterans Service Officer Matthew Elmore to present his Fiscal Year 2024 budgetary request to the committee. Mr. Elmore addressed the committee regarding his request to

increase the hours of the Veteran's Service Office part-time assistant from 14 to 20 hours per week. The committee took the request and information under advisement. No formal action was taken.

Mr. Robinson recognized EMS Director Mike Kerr to present his Fiscal Year 2024 budgetary request to the committee. Mr. Kerr addressed six (6) budgetary requests with the committee, including increased funding for salaries, equipment, and medical supplies. The committee took the requests and information under advisement. No formal action was taken.

Mr. Robinson recognized EMA Director Matt McBride to present his Fiscal Year 2024 budgetary request to the committee. Mr. McBride addressed nine (9) budgetary requests with the committee, including increased funding for salaries, travel, and equipment. Mr. McBride also requested that funding be included in the EMA budget to provide a pump test for each volunteer fire truck in the county. The committee took the requests and information under advisement. No formal action was taken.

Mr. Robinson asked the committee for any old business: There was none.

Coming from Steering Committee A, the committee considered a request to appropriate additional funding in the Highway Department fund for rock needed for roadway repairs. Mr. Marcum advised the committee that funds could be moved within the Highway Department major category as we near fiscal year and that immediate action was not necessary. Members of Solid Waste Committee are Commissioners Dakota White, TK Austin, Becky Golden, Jordan Cocke, Chris Brewington, Derrick Hutchings, and Larry Daniels.

The White County Solid Waste committee met Tuesday, April 4th, 2023 at the White County Courthouse. Chairman Austin called the meeting to order and requested roll call of committee members. Present were Commissioners, T.K. Austin, Dakota White, Becky Golden, Chris Brewington, Jordan Cocke, Derrick Hutchings, and Larry Daniels. Also, present was County Executive, Denny W. Robinson, Finance Director, Chad Marcum, and there were other members from the community. There being a quorum, Chairman Austin welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Approval of the previous Solid Waste Report

Chairman Austin opened the floor for discussion and approval of the Minutes from the March 7th, 2023 Solid Waste meeting. With no other discussion, Commissioner White made a motion and Commissioner Daniels seconded the motion to approve the Minutes as presented. With no objections the motion was approved.

Engineer's Report

TriAD is preparing the Class I Landfill Annual Engineering Report due to TDEC by May 1, 2023. Vick Surveying set grade stakes at the existing Class I landfill on March 23, 2023, ahead of Waste Management personnel mobilizing to the site to help address areas of existing overfill. We have yet to receive any communication from TDEC regarding the November 1, 2022, corrective action plan (CAP), to address the steep slopes on the western perimeter of the existing Class I landfill in accordance with the TDEC, Division of Solid Waste Management, Order and Assessment dated September 30, 2022, (received electronically October 5, 2022). The plan calls for the stabilization (i.e., erosion control matting, temporary vegetation) of the existing steep slopes ahead of wet winter conditions and until White County has procured the necessary landfill equipment to complete the slope repairs. The proposed completion date for proposed slope repairs is July 1, 2023.

A notice of completeness was received for the Class I landfill Expansion Area, Hydrogeologic Investigation Report from TDEC on February 14, 2023. The Hydrogeologic Investigation Report is currently under technical review. TriAD is continuing to coordinate with Waste Management and supplying additional site information, as necessary.

Discussion on Solid Waste RFP

Executive Robinson stated that he is expected to meet with Waste Management on April 13th and if they haven't provided the requested information that the committee has asked from them then he suggest that the committee may consider revoking the current RFP and reissuing a new RFP for the landfill. There was some discussion but no action was taken.

Discussion on Future Plans for Solid Waste

After some discussion on the future plans for the landfill, the committee compiled a list of their top concerns they would like to see addressed from Waste Management. Those concerns included:

- Ask for bid to lease/purchase
- Assume all liabilities
- Be responsible for White County trash for 50 years
- Host fee 10% Royalty (2% penalty exceeding pre-determined volume)
- Assume liabilities of closing old cell and opening new cell
- Maintain County Roads to landfill
- White County citizens allowed to bring trash up to a ton per year and require permit for anything over a ton (negotiate terms for private citizens entering landfill)
- Community commitment
- Option for county landfill employees to work with Waste Management

Old Business

Commissioner Brewington asked if adding the transfer station was still on the table for discussion. After some discussion it was decided that it's not an option at this time due to it not being cost effective and it would just be kicking the can down the road.

New Business

Purchasing additional property adjoining the landfill was discussed and Executive Robinson was instructed to look into it and report back to the committee with his findings.
