This property-will-be-incorporated-into-the-Dog-Cove-area-owned-and-maintained-by-the-State-of-Tennessee.

The White County Budget Committee met on Monday, May 1, 2023 following Steering Committee meetings at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Kyle Goff, Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson, Mr. TK Austin, Mr. Dakota White, and Mr. Robert McCormick. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum, Mr. Chris Brewington, Mr. Mike Kerr, Sheriff Steve Page, members of the community, and several members of the White County EMS and Sheriff Departments.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Robinson.

Mr. Robinson asked for approval of the minutes from the April 20, 2023 meeting. Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum asked the committee to pull the first amendment listed for the Violent Crime Intervention Fund grant. The funds will not be available from the state for expenditure until Fiscal Year 2024.

The committee considered two (2) General Fund amendments as follows:

- 1. Clerk & Master \$4,000 appropriation from data processing reserves for computer upgrades
- 2. Coroner/Medical Examiner \$60,000 appropriation to cover additional autopsy expenses Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum informed the committee that there were no School Federal Projects Fund amendments ready for review at this time.

Mr. Robinson opened the floor for discussion on the Fiscal Year 2024 General Fund budget. Mr. Marcum presented the committee with costs associated with the three salary scenarios as requested in the previous meeting. The committee discussed various scenarios of how to fund the requests, including moving property tax pennies from the Debt Service and General Purpose School Funds. The committee also discussed the possibility of forming a task force to investigate revenues outside of the property tax rate. The committee determined that employee raises was a priority. Mr. Marcum advised the committee that he would take that information and work on a budget scenario for the committee to consider.

Mr. Robinson recognized Mr. Matt McBride with White County EMA to address the committee. Mr. McBride offered clarification on some of the budget items he had requested and asked that the \$5,000 TEMA/FEMA salary/project reimbursement received by the county be used for salary increases for himself and the assistant director. The committee took no formal action.

Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to recess the Budget Committee meeting until Monday, May 8, 2023 at 5:00pm. The motion was unanimously approved.

The White County Budget Committee reconvened on Monday, May 8, 2023 at 5:00pm at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Kyle Goff, Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson, Mr. TK Austin, Mr. Dakota White, and Mr. Robert McCormick. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum, Mr. Chris Brewington, Mr. Mike Kerr, Sheriff Steve Page, members of the community, and several members of the White County EMS and Sheriff Departments.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was reconvened by Mr. Robinson.

The committee considered two (2) General Purpose School Fund amendments as follows:

- 1. Summer Learning Camps \$409,720.17 for the state funded summer school program
- 2. Summer Learning Camps Transportation \$74,311.99 for summer school transportation Mr. White made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission, contingent upon school board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Robinson opened the floor for continued discussion on the Fiscal Year 2024 General Fund budget. Mr. Marcum presented the committee with a budget scenario which would offer a 5% across the board raise with targeted raises for specific positions. The committee discussed the scenario at length and ways in which additional funding for raised could be obtained and appropriated.

Mr. Robinson recognized Mr. Stanley Neal from the audience to address the committee. Mr. Neal asked that the committee withdraw the additional \$45,000 in increased funding appropriated in the Fiscal Year 2023 budget for the White County Emergency Communications District. Mr. Neal stated that he felt the funding had not been appropriately used and would be more beneficial to county departments. The committee took no formal action.

The committee continued discussion on the Fiscal Year 2024 General Fund budget. The committee finally collectively determined to move forward with a 5% across the board raise, \$3.00 per hour for EMS, \$2.00 per hour for corrections officers (guards), and \$1.50 per hour for patrol deputies. Mr. Marcum advised that he would update the budget to reflect this and present it at the next meeting. The committee took no formal action.

After discussion, it was determined that the next meeting would be May 15, 2023 at 4:30pm.

Mr. White made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to adjourn. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Re: Report on Fiscal Year 2022 Audit Results

Dear Commissioners,

The White County Audit Committee met on May 8, 2023 to review the independent auditor's report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2022. The report detailed three finding for the fiscal year. The committee discussed the findings at length and ways in which the findings could be corrected in the future.

The committee reports that it concurs with the following audit finding detailed in the independent auditor's report:

Finding 2022-001:

Office of Finance Director - The Solid Waste Disposal Fund had a deficit in

unrestricted net position at June 30, 2022.

Finding 2022-002:

Office of Director of Schools - An investigation of the White County Schools

Transportation Department disclosed several deficiencies.

Finding 2022-003:

Office of County Clerk - An investigation of the office disclosed



WHEREAS; TCA Code § 38-7-104 requires White County to have a Medical Examiner to provide services to the county and its citizens; and

WHEREAS; a Medical Examiner is needed to conduct death investigations in coordination with various professionals in accordance with TCA § 38-7-108: Death under suspicious, unusual or unnatural circumstances, provide an opinion as to the cause and manner of death, completing of death certificates, issuing cremation permits, ordering an autopsy when necessary to determine cause and manner of death. Interacting with local and state government officials and departments.

WHEREAS, TCA Code § 38-7-104 requires that the County Mayor/Executive shall appoint a Medical Examiner, subject to confirmation by the county legislative body, based on a recommendation from a convention of physicians' resident in the county; and

WHEREAS; A county medical examiner shall serve a five-year term, and shall be eligible for reappointment by the county mayor with confirmation by the county legislative body. TCA Code § 38-7-104 c.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the White County Legislative Body, meeting in a regularly scheduled meeting, hereby confirms the appointment of Dr. Chad Griffin as White County's Medical Examiner. Charging him with the duties and reasonability required by Tennessee Code Annotated. Dr. Griffin's term shall end at midnight May 15, 2028. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon signature by the County Executive. The safety and well-being of the public dependent upon it.
