The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, August 3, 2023 at the White County Courthouse. **Members of Committee A, for 2022/2023 include, White County Commissioners T.K. Austin, Cain Rogers, Becky Golden, Lanny Selby, Thomas Margeson, Derrick Hutchings, and Larry Daniels.**

Agenda Item #1 - #3; Call to Order – Roll Call – Prayer:

Chairman Austin called the meeting of White County Steering A to order at 5:35pm and requested roll call of members present. K. England, Recorder called the roll of members in attendance. Members present were **Commissioners Cain Rogers, Lanny Selby, Becky Golden, Derrick Hutchings and Lanny Selby and Thomas Margeson.** With none absent, there was a quorum.

Also present were, Chad Marcum, WC Finance Director, Commissioners, Chris Brewington, Kyle Goff, Dakota White, Roger Mason, Executive Assistant, Brooke Luna and members of the White Co Sheriff Dept and several White County citizens.

There being a quorum present, Chairman Austin welcomed everyone, followed by opening prayer, led by Commissioner Lanny Selby.

Agenda Item #4 - Approval of Minutes from July 3, 2023 Steering A meeting.

Chairman Austin asked for review and approval of the Report from the July 3, 2023 Steering A meeting. Commissioner Selby made a motion to approve the Report as presented, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Margeson, without opposition, the motion was approved.

Agenda Item #5 -Establish Speed on Swamp Road – Dist. 7:

A request was brought to the committee by Commissioner Daniels requesting that a 25mph speed limit be set for Swamp Road in Dist. 7 of White County. Daniels stated that the road is not marked with speed limit and continuants have complained about excessive traffic speeds. With brief discussion, and no opposition, Commissioner Daniels made a motion to post Swamp Rd as 25mph speed limit and upon approval from full court request the WC Road Dept. to install signs; motion was seconded by Commissioner Hutchings. With none opposed the motion was approved.

Agenda Item #6 – Discussion to Add Ball Fields at the Hwy 70 Sports Complex

Mr. Don Percy, a White Co citizen and representative for Little League addressed the committee about the need for additional ball fields for youth and adults at the Hwy 70 ball fields. Percy stated that he had been informed that the fields behind YMCA would not be available for children to practice or conduct games as of October 2023 due to the City's plans to develop a splash park in that area. Mr. Percy stated that the interest in youth and adult sports has increased significantly over the past few years. Percy stated that in season 2020/2021 there were 380 youth registered in Little League compared to 555 that were registered in 2022/2023. The request for additional fields for both youth and adults' sports prompted several questions from the committee and was ultimately tabled until Mr. Percy and members of the

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commission could research other options that may be available at other fields in White Co. (Doyle, Metcalf Park), as well as any grant opportunities to help offset costs of new field(s) and / or fencing that would extend one of the existing fields at Hwy 70. No further discussion.

Agenda Item #7 – Discussion of Archery Range:

Chairman Daniels presented the idea of having an Archery Range / Obstacle on a portion of the Hwy 70 property behind the ball fields. Daniels stated that the Range/Obstacle course would be ASA approved and managed and maintained by Daniels and other citizens participating in the sport. Daniels announced that he had received a quote for bag targets that could be stationed throughout a section of the wooded area and that “archery/ range” area would be open to the public. Daniels received a quote for the bag targets and verbally presented the cost of each bag ranging from \$150 - \$250 per outdoor, all weather and ASA approved bag. Questions and concerns came from several committee members about the possible course being open to everyone around the clock, and questions and concerns about liability, possible conflict of interest and if the ASA organization would agree to an MOU or if ASA could draft a charter for the 20-target course. Discussion was tabled with the understanding that Commissioner Daniels would contact ASA representatives and discuss solutions to the many questions and concerns. No further action taken.

Agenda Item #8 – Discussion on Building Fees

Chairman Austin opened the floor for discussion on building fees. Executive Assistant, Brooke Luna requested that the discussion be tabled until Executive Robinson returned and could address the committee in regards to building fees. Luna’s request was granted by Chairman Austin and no further action was taken.

Agenda Item #9 – Old Business:

Chairman Austin opened the floor for any discussion of Old Business. Commissioner Hutchings invited members of the audience to re-address their efforts to restore Rowland Sawmill, a historical landmark in the Quebec community. The sawmill was donated to the White County Heritage Museum approximately six years ago and the museum’s budget is administered by the county. Over the years the property has deteriorated and community members desperately want to restore the 150-year-old historical landmark. Members of the Quebec/Walling community spoke about their efforts as citizens in trying to fundraise and gather volunteers to help with the restoration. Ms. Templeton with the Heritage Museum stated that approximately \$7,000 has been donated to support the project, and a fundraising event is scheduled for August 26, 2023 at 7pm with proceeds earmarked for the restoration project. Commissioner Hutchings made a motion to send a request for (up to) \$10,000 to Budget Committee to be earmarked the metal structure / awning covering for the Rowland Saw Mill Restoration project; motion was seconded by Commissioner Rogers, with none opposed the motion was approved.

Agenda Item #10 – New Business

Chairman Austin opened the floor for discussion of new business. Commissioner Daniels discussed the need for a 3-Way Stop Sign on Austin Road, pass Big Puckett’s Campground in District 7 of White County. Austin Road forks and currently there are no traffic postings where the road ends at 3 Way intersection. After brief discussion and comments from Commissioner Kyle Goff, Commissioner Daniels made a motion to establish a 3 Way Stop where Austin Rd and Browntown Rd intersect and send to full court for consideration, motion was seconded by Commissioner Margeson, with none opposed the motion was approved.

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In other (new) business, Commissioner recommended that the speed limit be reduced on Pettit Cove Rd, in District #5 of White County. After brief discussion, Commissioner Margeson made a motion to establish and post a reduced speed limit to 35mph (reduced from 45mph) on Petit Cove Road; motion was seconded by Commissioner Hutchings, with none opposed, the motion was approved.

Finally, after other discussion regarding the increase of requests, questions and concerns in the area of Parks & Recreation, Chairman Austin recommended that committee members, and citizens of White County research areas within Parks & Rec., review the previous Master Plan that was completed in 2022 and prepare for discussions on establishing county Parks & Rec sub-committee. Chairman Austin requested that the discussion be added to September agenda for Steering A.

Agenda Item #10 – Calendar Update

Chairman Austin announced the upcoming meetings for the White County Legislative Body and other calendar updates. The Regular Call meeting will be Monday, August 21, 2023 at the White County Courthouse, 3rd floor courtroom at 6:00 pm.

The next Steering A meeting will be Monday, September 11, 2023 (delayed one week due to the 1st Monday being a recognized holiday (Labor Day). The meeting will be at the White County Courthouse, 2nd floor Executive Conference Room at 5:30 pm.

Agenda item # 10 – Adjourn:

There being no further business, Commissioner Lanny Selby made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Hutchings, with none opposed, the motion was approved. Meeting was adjourned at 6:40pm.

After some discussion Commissioner White made a motion that to send to full court for approval and requested that this resolution be sent to all of our state legislatures, seconded by Chairman Mason; with no objections the motion was approved.

The White County Budget Committee met on Monday, August 7, 2023 following the Solid Waste Committee at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Commissioner Kyle Goff, Commissioner TK Austin, Commissioner Dakota White, and Commissioner Robert McCormick. Also present were Director of Finance Chad Marcum, Commissioner Derrick Hutchings, Captain Nate Theiss, Major John Meadows, and members of the community. Absent was County Executive Denny Wayne Robinson.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Goff.

Mr. Goff asked for approval of the minutes from the June 12, 2023 meeting. Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Fiscal Year 2024 School Federal Projects Fund budget in the amount of \$41,000.00 for Subfund 941 – Summer Literacy Training Stipend. Mr. White made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the budget as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered re-establishing a Fiscal Year 2024 Highway Capital Projects Fund – Fund 176 budget in the amount of \$2,911,205 for the construction of a new bridge on Roberts-Matthews Highway over Post Oak Creek. Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the proposed budget as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered approval of six (6) General Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. County Buildings - \$5,726 appropriation for prior year insurance deductible billing
2. County Buildings - \$42,533 appropriation for FY24 insurance premiums in excess of budget
3. County Buildings - \$643,020 appropriation for Justice Center re-roof project
4. County Buildings - \$28,000 appropriation for security fencing at Justice Center
5. Sheriff's Department - \$680,490 appropriation for School Resource Officer Program
6. Sheriff's Department - \$97,045 appropriation of Violent Crime Intervention Fund grant

Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the budget amendments as presented, and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Highway Public Works Fund line-item amendment in the amount of \$2,497 to reallocate funds for FY24 insurance premiums in excess of budget. Mr. White made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the line-item amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

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The committee considered two (2) School Federal Projects Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. Subfund 801 – CTE Perkins Basic: \$13,909.91 additional federal allocation
2. Subfund 901 – IDEA, Part B: \$6,000 reallocation for IEP software

Mr. White made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Goff asked the committee for any old business:

Mr. Goff asked Mr. Meadows and Mr. Theiss to provide a brief update on how some of the projects recently funded by the County Commission have proved beneficial to the Sheriff's Department. Mr. Meadows recounted two instances regarding the new in-car CAD software and how it had assisted deputies in response time and preparedness.

Mr. Goff asked the committee for any new business:

Mr. Marcum brought forward a General Purpose School Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$153,079.80 to appropriate Public-School Security Grant funds received from the State of Tennessee for school safety improvements throughout the school district. Mr. McCormick made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to approve the budget amendment as presented, contingent upon school board approval, and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum brought forward the following Fiscal Year 2024 School Federal Projects Fund budgets as follows:

1. Subfund 933 – ESSER 2.0: \$237,499.57 Carry-over
2. Subfund 938 – Math Implementation Support Grant: \$71,250.00
3. Subfund 936 – TN All Corps: \$191,100.00

Mr. White made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the budgets as presented, contingent upon school board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Coming from Steering Committee B, the committee discussed appropriating up to \$7,000 for clean-up at the Rowland Saw Mill located in the Quebeck Community. The committee discussed the matter at length and determined more information was needed to understand exactly what type and how extensive the cleanup needed to be. The committee asked that clarification be provided before moving forward with an amendment. No formal action was taken.

Coming from Steering Committee A, the committee discussed appropriating up to \$10,000 for the construction of a building at the Rowland Saw Mill located in the Quebeck Community. Mr. Marcum explained that the estimated project cost provided to Committee A was in excess of \$10,000 and the county would be responsible for also appropriating funds above the \$10,000 even if those funds originated as donations. No formal action was taken.

Mr. Goff opened the floor for comments from the audience:

White County, Tennessee

Mr. Theiss inquired as to the commission's willingness to appropriate funding for a full-time sexual assault/domestic abuse detective at the end of a three-year grant period. Mr. Theiss explained that as part of the grant application process the county had to provide a response as to how or if it would continue funding the position if awarded the grant. The committee discussed the request and instructed Mr. Theiss that they could make not guarantee that additional funding would be allocated toward the department for this, but encouraged Mr. Theiss to apply for the grant if possible. No formal action was taken.

After discussion, the next meeting was scheduled for Monday, September 11, 2023 following the Solid Waste Committee.

Mr. McCormick made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to adjourn. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.





RESOLUTION 59-08-2023

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE PRESERVE THE FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT OF TENNESSEANS TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution reads as follows: “*A well-regulated Militia being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms shall not be infringed.*”; and

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution was incorporated and enforceable against the states in 2010 by the Supreme Court in *McDonald v. Chicago* 561 U.S. 742, reinforcing an earlier decision in *District of Columbia v. Heller* 554 U.S. 570 (2008) emphasizing the individual right of citizens to keep and bear arms; and

WHEREAS, self-defense and self-preservation are rights bestowed by God to all people; and

WHEREAS, so-called “red flag” laws are repugnant to the United States Constitution specifically to the Second Amendment, because such laws, 1) potentially deprive law abiding citizens to their right to self-defense, 2) violate the due process by potentially depriving a citizen of property and self-defense based on presumptions, accusations, or a prediction of future behavior of a person and, 3) unfairly punish and infringe without a criminal conviction, the right of citizens to keep and bear arms.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislative Body of White County Tennessee, meeting this 21st day of August 2023 as follows:

SECTION 1: That the General Assembly of the State is urged to reject any so-called “red flag” legislation that, 1) infringes on the God-given right of law-abiding Tennesseans to self-defense, 2) VIOLATES THE Due Process clause of the United States Constitution by depriving a citizen of future behavior of a person, or 3) punishes a citizen by infringing on their right to keep and bear arms short of a criminal conviction.

SECTION 2: That the General Assembly of the state of Tennessee focus on the root cause of violent crime, utilizing better enforcement of existing gun laws to deprive violent criminals or the properly adjudicated mentally ill of their ability to do harm, and provide services appropriate to treat conditions that may lead to violent crime.


