Steering A Committee Meeting

The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, December 5, 2022 at the White County Courthouse. Members of Committee A, for 2022/2023 include, White County Commissioners T.K. Austin, Cain Rogers, Becky Golden, Lanny Selby, Thomas Margeson, Derrick Hutchings, and Larry Daniels.

Agenda item #1 - #3; Call to Order - Roll Call - Prayer:

Chairman Austin called the meeting of White County Steering A to order and requested roll call of members present. K. England, Recorder called the roll of members in attendance. Members present were Commissioners Cain Rogers, Lanny Selby, Becky Golden, Derrick Hutchings and Lanny Selby. Commissioner Thomas Margeson was absent.

Also present were Executive Denny Wayne Robinson, Chad Marcum, WC Finance Director, Commissioners Roger Mason, Chris Brewington, Robert McCormick and several White County citizens.

There being a quorum present, Chairman Austin welcomed everyone, followed by opening prayer, led by Commissioner Lanny Selby.

Agenda item #4 - Approval of Minutes from October 3, 2022 Steering A meeting.

Chairman Austin asked for review and approval of the Report from the November 7, 2022 Steering A meeting. Commissioner Rogers made a motion to approve the Report as presented, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Selby, without opposition, the motion was approved.

Agenda item #5 – Discussion on Speed Limit and Length of Austin Rd:

Before discussion on speed limit, Executive Robinson asked to discuss a discrepancy between the official county road list and E911 addresses. While researching information on Austin Road speed limit change it was discovered that White County's Road List had Austin Road shorter and Browntown Road longer than E911 and E911 addressing. After discussion it was determined that it would be less burdensome on the residents to change the official lengths on the road list rather than having E911 and residents change their addresses. Commissioners Rogers made a motion to shorten Browntown Road by 0.32 miles and extend Austin Road by 0.32 miles, contingent upon passage by the White County Planning Commission; motion was seconded by Commissioner Hutchings; with none opposed the motion was approved.

Additionally, a request was made to reduce the speed limit on Austin Rd, from 45mph to 35mph. Commissioner Goff stated that he and Road Superintendent, Jerry Sawyer went to survey the area and determined that a reduced speed limit would benefit residents in that area. A motion to

reduce the speed limit contingent upon the Planning Committee's decision to lengthen the road by .32 mile was made by Commissioner Hutchings, seconded by Commissioner Daniels; with none opposed the motion was approved.

Agenda item # 6 – Old Business:

Commissioner Hutchings asked for an update on hiring a part-time Parks & Rec employee. Executive Robinson recommended that the discussion be tabled until the Budget Committee met to finalize the 2023-2024 budget. Members of the Budget Committee will meet regularly through March – April 2023 for budgetary discussions. No further discussion or action was taken.

Another item of Old Business was brought before the committee by Executive Robinson. Executive Robinson stated that he had been in contact with the state elections office and any "special called "elections would have a specific timeline. Robinson stated that a special called election is required to take place between 75 and 90 days of filing the paperwork with the state's election office. Executive Robinson noted that he had spoken with School Superintendent, Kurt Dronebarger regarding any issues in closing the schools due to voting precincts being at multiple schools throughout the district. Also, Robinson noted that citizens living inside the Sparta city limits would not be eligible to vote. March 7, 2023 OR March 14th are two dates that will be discussed with Mr. Dronebarger for the county to have a special called election. Executive Robinson will confirm a date and report back to Steering A members before proceeding with the official paperwork.

After brief discussion and unanimous consensus, the committee is in favor of calling a special election to increase the sales tax (within the county) to match the current sales tax rate in the city. If passed, the sales tax increase would match the city's 9.75% rate. Commissioner Hutchings made a motion to call for a special election to increase the county sales tax rate from 9.5% to match the city's sales tax rate of 9.75%, motion was seconded by Commissioner Selby; with none opposed the motion was approved.

Mr. Dewayne Howard, citizen and farmer in White County respectfully requested to bring an item of Old Business to the committee. With permission, Howard explained that the WC School System has been awarded a 1.5 million dollar Integrated Agricultural Grant from the State of Tennessee to be used for agriculture educational programs. Howard recommended that the county partner with the school system and allow the use of property located at Hwy 70 for agricultural, hands-on training. Executive Robinson stated that the committee had discussed this previously, however, the last update he (Robinson) received from Mr. Dronebarger was that the school system would not be doing anything regarding the Agricultural program until April 2023. Chairman Austin suggested that Executive Robinson contact Mr. Dronebarger and request an update on the grant and what their needs would be to establish the agricultural program(s).

Agenda item #7 – New Business:

Chairman Austin opened the floor for new business. Chairman Austin asked if a conference phone could be purchased for the purpose of those who wish to call in during county meetings. Additional discussion included technology that would allow meetings to be broadcast over social

media outlets. Executive Robinson stated that he or Chad Marcum could contact Ben Lomand to request a quote on adding an additional line or phone for this purpose. Robinson further stated that a new meeting area would need to be established in order to set up or purchase the equipment necessary to broadcast meetings live over social media outlets. No further action was taken.

Kim England requested to speak about the new Empower Program. With permission, England invited the commissioners and citizens to attend the Empower Introduction meeting on Tuesday, Dec. 6th, 8:30 at Oldham Theatre to learn more about this new poverty management program that will assist White Co. families, with children overcome barriers that prevents them from working or increasing their income. England explained that additional information about the Empower program will be discussed at the meeting on 12/6/22.

Commissioner Chris Brewington raised the question regarding conflict of interest by county elected officials. Executive Robinson and Chad Marcum, Finance Director explained that an elected official could not bid on contracts paid by the county, whether it be a written contract or a verbal contract. Robinson suggested that anyone who questions this could contact CTAS or the state to review the law prohibiting county/state elected officials from bidding or joining in any type of paid contract with the county government. No further action was taken.

Chairman Austin called the meeting to order and requested roll call of committee members. Present were Commissioners, T.K. Austin, Dakota White, Becky Golden, Chris Brewington, Derrick Hutchings, and Larry Daniels. Absent was Commissioners, Jordan Cocke and Larry Daniels. Also, present was County Executive, Denny W. Budget Committee Meeting

The White County Budget Committee met on Monday, December 5, 2022 following the Solid Waste Committee at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Kyle Goff, Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson, Mr. TK Austin, Mr. Dakota White, and Mr. Robert McCormick. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum and Mr. Matt McBride.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Robinson.

Mr. Robinson asked for approval of the minutes from the November 7, 2022 meeting. Mr. White made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered five (5) General Fund amendments as follows:

- 1. EMA \$6,300 for purchase of a thermal capable drone utilizing TEMA reimbursement funds
- 2. Family Treatment Court \$5,500 for increased grant funding from state
- 3. Sheriff's Department \$2,000 for Wal-Mart Foundation grant funding
- 4. Sheriff's Department \$13,901 for Firehouse Subs grant funding
- 5. Sheriff's Department \$16,930 for vehicle purchase utilizing funds from surplus vehicles

Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund amendment in the amount of \$7,460 to increase Central Maintenance mechanic pay from \$16.83 per hour to \$19.00 per hour for the remainder of the fiscal year. The committee discussed how this might be funded in the current budget and in future budgets. Additional consideration was also given to the hourly rates paid for similar positions across the county. The matter was tabled until the January 2023 meeting.

The committee considered a General Fund line-item amendment in the amount of \$1,155 to reallocate funding in the Jail budget by reducing a Lieutenant position to a Guard position and taking the difference in hourly wages and providing raises to the Major, Captain, and Warrants Officer/Courtroom Security Assistant positions. Mr. White made a motion and Mr. Austin seconded the motion to approve the line-item amendment as presented, contingent upon an updated salary agreement being completed between the Sheriff and County Executive. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Robinson asked the committee for any old business:

Mr. Marcum brought forward information for the committee's consideration regarding Parks and Recreation funding and the potential for a part-time Parks and Recreation Director position. The committee discussed the matter and determined that it would look to address the part-time position in the Fiscal Year 2024 budget negation process. No formal action was taken.

Mr. Goff inquired as to Steering Committee A's proposal to hold a special called election for the purpose of increasing the local option sales tax rate to match that of the City of Sparta. Mr. Robinson stated that estimated costs for the election would be between \$25,000 and \$30,000. It was determined that the committee would take up the matter of approving the required additional funding, if the election was called for by the County Commission in the December meeting. No formal action was taken.

Mr. Robinson asked the committee for any new business: There was none.

After discussion, it was determined that the next meeting would be January 3, 2022 following Steering Committee A.

Mr. Austin made a motion and Mr. White seconded the motion to adjourn. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

MINUTES FOR THE WHITE COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BOARD MEETING Wednesday, May 18, 2022

The meeting was called to order on Thursday, December 8th, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. A quorum was present.

With the quorum being present, the meeting was called to order. The first order of business was approval of the minutes from the meeting which occurred on Wednesday, June 29, 2022. Hoyt Jones made a motion that the minutes be approved. The motion was seconded by Mike Prater. All members voted in favor thereof and the minutes from the June, 29, 2022 IDB Meeting were approved.

The next order was business was a discussion regarding future industrial property. White County Executive Denny Wayne Robinson related he continues to receive many inquiries regarding available properties in White County. The problem however, is locating properties of suitable size and location. Several properties were discussed by members of the board most or all of which were unsuitable due to size, lack of necessary infrastructure, environmental concerns, or a combination thereof.

The next order of business was an update on the HMMI/TDEC issues. Sam Benningfield, County Attorney, updated the board on the current status thereof and discussed the legal issues involved. The federal lawsuit has temporarily been withdrawn with the purpose of allowing all

parties involved to attempt to negotiate a settlement and distribution of costs for the study identifying the problems and remediation. County Executive Robinson gave an update on the remaining TDEC issues, none of which are in litigation.

The next order of business was discussion regarding the Jackson Kayak Property. White Consort has proposed selling the approximately 8.5 acre parcel adjacent to its primary property to White County for \$90,000.00. The said parcel does have a land use restriction but would give the county 8 acres on the railway. The size of the property however, would be very limiting in its potential use. If the county decided to buy the land White Consort requests it be released from the Pilot Program. After much discussion Mike Prater made the motion, the board decline the purchase of said property, the approximately 8.5-acre parcel of road frontage of 3300 McMinnville Highway, offered by White Consort. Ben Clark seconded the motion. The motion passed by roll call vote with all members voting yes except Megan Choate who voted no.

In a similar issue, the next order of business also concerned the Jackson Kayak Property. It was related to the board White Consort is selling its Research and Development building and the .7 acres it is on at 3216 McMinnville Highway and requests that property be released from the Pilot Program. After some discussion Megan Choate made a motion to grant the request of White Consort to release the Research and Development building property at 3216 McMinnville Highway from the Pilot Program and allow the IDB chairman to execute the release. The motion was seconded by Gary Peterson. The motion passed by roll call vote with all voting yes.

The next order of business was old business. There was none.

The next order of business was new business. Denny Wayne Robinson presented the board with the Financial Report, Fiscal Year 2023, July 1, 2022 - November 30, 2022. After review of same, Hoyt Jones made the motion to approve the report which was seconded by Gary Peterson. A roll call vote resulted in unanimous approval.

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RESOLUTION 86-12-2022 AMENDING LENGTHS OF AUSTIN AND BROWNTOWN ROADS ON COUNTY ROAD LIST TO CORRELATE WITH 911 ADRESSING

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 54-10-103 requires that the County have a road List and Road Map for the Highway Superintendent to have guidelines to go by; and

RESOLUTION 88-12-2022 AUTHORIZING LEVY OF ADDITIONAL SALES AND USE TAX

WHEREAS, the official tax rate of the county is the number used by the State of Tennessee to determine the equitable division of sales tax revenue in White County and the cities within White County, and; WHEREAS, The State of Tennessee recognizes the official tax rate as 2.25%, the rate set by White County, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Sparta, by referendum, has raised the city's sales tax rate by 0.5% to 2.75% thus surpassing the county's official rate, and;

WHEREAS, the County Commission, in an attempt to avoid confusion and to ensure the continuation of equitable distribution of tax revenue for the benefit of ALL citizens residing within White County and its Cities, deems it judicious that the sales and use tax rate be consistent and equal across the county.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the White County Legislative Body hereby propose an 0.5% increase in local option sales and use tax and furthermore request the White County Election Commission to authorize a special called election at a date to be set by the Election Commission, as called for in section 2, allowing the option to vote "For" or "Against" on the ballot. The Ballot shall read "Shall Resolution No. 88-12-2022 passed by the White County Commission which increases the local sales tax rate from 2.25% to 2.75% become operative?"

SECTION 1. The resolution of the county legislative body of White County, Tennessee, imposing a local sales and use tax as authorized under the provisions of *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Sections 67-6-701 through 67-6-712, adopted by the county legislative body at a regular meeting of record in **Minute Book 58, page 196**, is amended to levy a local sales and use tax at a rate of 2.75%, not to exceed the maximum percentage as stated in the RETAILERS TAX ACT, *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-6-702, as amended, except as limited or modified by statute.

SECTION 2. If a majority of those voting in the special called election required by *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-6-706, vote for the increase in the tax imposed by this resolution, collection of the increased tax levied by this resolution shall begin on the first day of the month occurring thirty (30) or more days after the county election commission makes its official canvass of the election returns.

SECTION 3. The Department of Revenue of the State of Tennessee shall collect the additional tax imposed by this Resolution concurrent with the collection of the state tax and the local tax now being collected for White County, in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the Department.

SECTION 4. The County Executive is hereby authorized to contract with the Department of Revenue for the collection of the additional tax imposed by this Resolution, and to provide in the contract that the department may deduct from the tax collected a reasonable amount or percentage to cover the expense of the administration and collection of the tax.

SECTION 5. In the event the tax is collected by the Department of Revenue, suits for the recovery of any

tax illegally assessed or collected shall be brought against the state Commissioner of Revenue and the White County Executive.

SECTION 6. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Department of Revenue by the County Clerk forthwith and shall be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in White County prior to the election called for in Section 2.
