Present and residing the Honorable Stanley Neal-Chairman, Denny Wayne Robinson-County Executive, Sasha Wilson- White County Clerk, Chad Marcum- Finance Director and John Meadows- County Attorney. County Commissioners present were Lanny Selby, Dale Bennett, Robert McCormick, Cain Rogers, Stanley Neal, T.K Austin, Dakota White, Roger Mason. Absent; Lee Broyles, Terry Alley, Dillard Quick, Bobby McCulley and Andy Haston.

A quorum being present the following proceedings were held.

Motion was made by Commissioner Lanny Selby and seconded by Commissioner T.K Austin to Approve and Spread on Minutes Consent Calendar. Chairman Neal called for a voice vote; all members in favor of said motion.

#### Steering A

The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, December 7, 2020, at the White County Courthouse. Members of Committee A include Commissioners Lanny Selby, Chairman, Dillard Quick, Cain Rogers, Terry Alley, Lonnie Selby, Lee Broyles, and Bobby McCulley.

Chairman Selby called the meeting to order and requested roll call. Members present include, Lanny Selby, Chairman, Dillard Quick, Cain Rogers, Terry Alley and Lonnie Selby. Absent were Commissioners Bobby McCulley and Lee Broyles. Also present were County Executive, Denny W. Robinson, Brooke Luna, Administrative Assistant and Gaylen Barlow. There being a quorum, the meeting continued with opening prayer led by Commissioner Alley.

Chairman Selby asked for review and approval of the Minutes from the October 5<sup>th</sup> meeting. With no discussion, Commissioner Alley made a motion and Commissioner Crouch seconded the motion to approve the Minutes as presented. With no objections the motion was approved.

Chairman Selby open the floor by requesting an update from the Parks and Rec Sub-Committee. Prior to the meeting, Commissioner Mason sent an announcement by Executive Robinson stating that the P&R Committee had not met since October. The P&R committee is scheduled to meet Tuesday, December 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm at the WC Courthouse.

Committee members had a brief discussion on county owned mineral rights. Executive Robinson gave a brief history of how mineral rights were obtained when (primarily) coal mining companies went out of business years ago and unable to pay land taxes. Robinson further stated that recently citizens had been calling requesting to purchase the mineral rights that are on the properties they have purchased. Currently the process includes the property owner hiring an attorney and obtain court approval to gain mineral rights at the owner(s) expense. Robinson has had multiple conversations with county attorney John Meadows and other county officials would ease the burden of the property owner(s). As noted, all property owned by the county must be sold at public auction. Attorney Meadows suggested that due to the process that the county must follow to auction county owned property, it is more feasible for both the county and property owner to continue following the current process and allow the Chancery Court to award mineral rights back to the property owner(s). No action was taken by the committee.

In further discussion, Executive Robinson brought a request from local resident, Ricky Jenkins to close Bob Davis Road, a current county road in White County. According to Jenkins, he owns

three (3) tracks of land on Bob Davis Road and is requesting that the road be closed leading through the three (3) tracks of land. Robinson stated that future issues could arise if Jenkins sold any of the three (3) tracks and suggested that Jenkins combine the three (3) tracks into one (1) parcel. Jenkins amended his request asking that the road be closed only up to the smallest partial. After discussion, Commissioner Quick made a motion to send the issue to full court on Monday, Dec. 14, 2020 for further review and discussion; Rogers seconded the motion. With no objections, the motion was approved.

Old Business - There was no old business was brought to the committee for discussion.

New Business - A copy of the recent utility bill for the WC Animal Shelter was presented to committee members for discussion. Electric bills have been steadily rising over the past few months with the recent utility bill being \$710. It was noted that several electric heaters were being ran continuously outdoors to heat the covered dog pins at the shelter. After further discussion, Executive Robinson agreed to visit the shelter and assess how the shelter could run more efficiently.

With no further discussion or business, Chairman Selby announced that the White Co. Legislative Body will meet in regular session on Monday, December 14, at 6pm. This regular called meeting was moved up one (1) week due the Christmas holiday.

The next Steering Committee A meeting will be Monday, January 4, 2021 at 5:30 pm.

There being no further business, Commissioner Crouch made a motion and Commissioner Rogers seconded to adjourn. With no objections, the motion was approved.

The White County Steering Committee B met on Monday, December 7, 2020, at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Stanley Neal, Dakota White, Robert McCormick, T.K. Austin, Dale Bennett, and Roger Mason. Also present were Chad Marcum, Denny Wayne Robins, Steve Page, and White County Corrections Officers.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Robert McCormick and prayer was led by Roger Mason.

Robert McCormick did a roll call for all members present and showing one absence, with that being Andy Haston.

Robert McCormick asked for approval of the minutes from the previous meeting. Roger Mason made a motion and Dakota White seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was approved by all members.

#### **Update about HSE Committee:**

Denny Wayne Robinson advised there is a provision that a violation or tax lien cannot be upheld on owner-occupied property. Civil action can be taken, however, and the individual can be fined. Mr. Robinson stated the county would need a private act passed to change the provision by the General Assembly. Stanley Neal made a motion and T.K. Austin seconded the motion to send to full court a resolution to the General Assembly asking for passage of a private act. The motion was approved by all members. Mr. Robinson stated he would send the resolution to include the commissioners as a body.

Mr. Robinson and commissioners also discussed hiring someone for the Health and Safety Codes Officer position and bringing the applications before the commissioners to review. Mr. Robinson advised he would check to see if the position needs to be a certified officer.

#### Discussion on White County Jail—Life Check System:

Sheriff Steve Page was present to discuss Life Check System for the White County Jail and said it was a good program. He advised the system would allow corrections officers to do their job more efficiently and the officers would be responsible for the maintenance of the system. Sheriff Page informed commissioners of what the system can do and that it would help with storage issues with it being an automated system and not paper, as they are using now. Sheriff Page stated there would be a 60-day trial period to use the system, that the company is waiving the setup fee, and the company is providing three devices free of charge. There would be a \$500 per month fee to use the system--\$6,000 per year. Chad Marcum stated the matter would need to go before the Budget Committee for approval. Roger Mason

made a motion and Dakota White seconded the motion to send the matter to the Budget Committee. The motion was approved by all members.

#### Old Business:

Stanley Neal discussed the County-Wide Fire Department Committee advising members would include Stanley Neal, Lanny Selby, the Firefighters Association Chairman, citizen Tommy Austin, and the Putnam County Fire Chief. The committee will review the feasibility of having a county-wide fire department. Mr. Robinson stated the Fire Marshall suggested having the Rescue Squad included. It was also discussed to possibly include someone with an insurance/financial background to help in the matter. Mr. Neal will check into the matter.

#### New Business:

Sheriff Page asked if they had received any Cares Act money and how it was being allocate. Chad Marcum explained how the money was being used.

Sheriff Page asked about sick time rollover toward retirement. Mr. Marcum stated that was not a Steering Committee B issue, but that it is being looked at and discussed.

Full Court meeting will be Monday, December 14, 2020, at 6:00 pm.

The next Steering Committee B meeting will be Monday, January 4, 2021, at 5:30 pm.

There being no further business, Stanley Neal made a motion and Dakota White seconded the motion to adjourn. The motion was approved by all members.

The White County Solid Waste committee met Monday, December 7, 2020, at the White County Courthouse. Members of Solid Waste Committee are Commissioners Dillard Quick, Chairman, Andy Haston, T.K. Austin, Lanny Selby, Bobby McCulley, Robert McCormick, and Lee Broyles.

Chairman Quick requested roll call of committee members. Present were Commissioners Quick, Selby, McCormick, and Austin. Absent were Commissioner Broyles, Haston and McCulley. Also present were County Executive, Denny W. Robinson, Brooke Luna, Executive Assistant, Gaylen Barlow, Solid Waste Director and Chad Marcum, Finance Director. There being a quorum, the meeting was called to order.

Chairman Quick opened the floor by requesting review, discussion, and approval of the Minutes from the October 5<sup>th</sup> meeting. With no discussion, Commissioner Austin made a motion and Commissioner Selby seconded the motion to approve the Minutes as presented. With no objections the motion was approved.

Chairman Quick requested the Directors report from Solid Waste Director, Gaylen Barlow. Barlow reported that the department is currently short-staffed due to illness/COVID-19. Barlow further stated that drilling at the new cell site is set to begin later in the week.

In further discussion, a request to surplus a 1998 Peterbilt roll off truck owned by the WC Solid Waste Dept. was presented to members. A motion by Commissioner McCormick was made to list and sale the 1998 Peterbilt on deals.gov; motion seconded by Commissioner Selby. With no further discussion and no objections, motion was approved.

Executive Robinson reviewed the Engineers report from TriAd with members. According to the report, TriAd has received approval from TDEC to proceed with the additional hydrogeologic workplan to demonstrate that the high ground elevations, measured previously by Doug Brady with TDEC/Cookeville, within the proposed expansion represent perched water rather than the upper most aquifer. The drill rig is scheduled to mobilize to the site on Wednesday, December 9<sup>th</sup>. It is anticipated that drilling and piezometer installation will take one (1) to two (2) weeks to complete.

#### **Old Business:**

Barlow asked the committee about the status of repairing the fencing around the Doyle Convivence Center. The Center is located directly in front of a rock quarry in Doyle, TN and the quote submitted for repairs was much higher due to additional drilling that would be required to place the posts in the ground. Executive Robinson stated that he would contact TDEC and ask if the posts could be placed in large containers/buckets secured by concrete in order to spare the extreme costs associated with extensive ground drilling. Robinson will update members at the next meeting.

#### **New Business:**

Executive Robinson stated that Jet Palmer Recycling had contacted his office and agreed to furnish a bailer and bail cardboard for recycling. If agreed, Jet Palmer Recycling would pick up and haul the cardboard for sixty (60%) of market value with White County receiving forty (40%) percent of the proceeds. However, the contract would require that the cardboard be bailed in a dry location. Executive Robinson requested that the County Commission consider approving funding for a pole-type shed to store cardboard. Chad Marcum, Director of Financing stated that RFQ 's (Request for Qualifications) would be required before proceeding with the purchase or construction of a dry shed storage. Commissioner Austin made a motion to move forward with the RFQ's and bring the matter back to committee next month; motion seconded by Commissioner McCormick. With no further discussion or objections, the motion was approved.

Executive Robinson announced that he had agreed to receive two (2) loads of dirt, from DeKalb County, to be delivered to the White County landfill. TDEC required the soil to be moved from the area around an underground storage tank in DeKalb County. TDEC has permitted and approved for the soil to be transferred. No further action was taken.

With no other announcements or business, Chairman Quick announced that the White Co. Legislative Body will meet in regular session on Monday, December 14<sup>th</sup> at 6pm. The regular called meeting of the Legislative Body was moved up a week due to the Christmas holiday schedule.

The next Solid Waste Committee meeting will be Monday, January 4, 2021 immediately following Steering A meeting.

There being no further business, Commissioner Selby made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Austin. With no objections, the meeting was adjourned.

The White County Financial Management Committee met on Wednesday, December 9, 2020 at 4:00pm at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Dillard Quick, Mr. Kurt Dronebarger, Mr. Robert McCormick, and Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson. Also present was Mr. Chad Marcum and Ms. Jennifer Rigsby. Absent were Mr. Lee Broyles, Mr. Lanny Selby, and Mr. Clay Parker.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Quick.

Mr. Quick asked for approval of the minutes from the October 27, 2020 meeting. Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. Dronebarger seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum addressed the committee regarding finance department operations, including payroll tax disbursements and filings as well as sales tax collections.

The committee considered a recommendation from the Finance Department to formally adopt a policy to waive credit and debit card processing fees for payments received through the Finance Department. Currently, this would include processing fees for EMS, Solid Waste, and Animal Shelter. This has been the practice of the department historically, but as per TCA §9-1-108 the County Commission should formally approve this practice. The waiving of fees would not apply to any other office or department of the county, but only transactions processed through the Finance Department's processing accounts. After discussion, Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. McCormick seconded the motion to present a resolution to the County Commission for approval to waive all processing fees and charges for credit or debit cards processed through the White County Department of Finance processing accounts. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Quick asked the committee for any old business: There was none.

Mr. Quick asked the committee for any new business:

Mr. Robinson asked Ms. Rigsby to provide a brief update on how things were progressing with the new Human Resources department. Ms. Rigsby stated that she has hit the ground running, starting first with the school system which has kept her very busy. She is currently meeting with department heads and elected officials on the county side to hear their concerns and ways in which HR can help. Ms. Rigsby stated that she is enjoying the job very much.

After discussion, it was determined that the next meeting would Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 12 Noon.

The White County Budget Committee met on Wednesday, December 9, 2020 at 5:00pm at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Andy Haston, Mr. Stanley Neal, and Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum, Mr. Earl Jones Jr., Mr. Kevin Benton, and other members of the White County Corrections Department staff. Absent was Mr. Cain Rogers and Mr. Bobby McCulley.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Robinson.

Mr. Robinson asked for approval of the minutes from the October 5, 2020 meeting. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$23,276 to appropriate funding for a Dislocated Worker COVID-19 Disaster Recovery Grant from the Upper Cumberland Local Workforce Development Board. Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the budget amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$117,000 to appropriate funding for the 2019/2020 Community Development Block Grant program. This amount represents the grant budget which was not spent in the prior fiscal year. Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the budget amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$12,500 to appropriate funding for Tennessee Risk Management Trust insurance premiums which were in excess of original estimates for fiscal year 2021. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the budget amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$76,836 to appropriate funding for a Christmas Bonus for all active employees as of November 1, 2020. The bonus would be \$400 for full time employees and \$200 for part time employees. The employee must have been employed as of November 1, 2020 and still be employed on the date of distribution. The bonus would not apply to an elected or appointed official whose salary is set in accordance with state law. Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the amendment and stipulations as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund line-item amendment in the amount of \$1,000 for the Corrections Department COVID-19 grant. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the line-item amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a recommendation from Steering Committee B to appropriate \$3,000 from the General Fund for a maintenance agreement with Life Check Systems for the remainder of the fiscal year. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund line-item amendment in the amount of \$3,086 to reclassify two employees within the EMS Department. Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the line-item amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Highway/Public Works Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$10,033 to appropriate funding for a Christmas Bonus for all active employees as of November 1, 2020. The bonus would be \$400 for full time employees and \$200 for part time employees. The employee must have been employed as of November 1, 2020 and still be employed on the date of distribution. The bonus would not apply to an elected or appointed official whose salary is set in accordance with state law. Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendment and stipulations as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Solid Waste Disposal Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$10,442 to appropriate funding for a Christmas Bonus for all active employees as of November 1, 2020. The bonus would be \$400 for full time employees and \$200 for part time employees. The employee must have been employed as of November 1, 2020 and still be employed on the date of distribution. The bonus would not apply to an elected or appointed official whose salary is set in accordance with state law. Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendment and stipulations as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a School Federal Projects Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$5,136 to correct a clerical error in a prior approved amendment for Title V – Subfund 501. Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the budget amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a School Federal Projects Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$135,740 to redistribute funds as needed for the school system's response to COVID-19 from Subfund 931 — Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Program (ESSER). Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the budget amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a School Federal Projects Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$5,220.50 for Subfund 901 – IDEA, Part B Special Education. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented, contingent upon School Board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Robinson asked the committee for any old business: There was none.

Mr. Robinson asked the committee for any new business:

Mr. Earl Jones, Jr. approached the committee regarding the Assessor of Property's need for a new vehicle to use when reviewing parcels. Mr. Jones stated that the current vehicle utilized by the office was purchased through State of Tennessee for \$800. They have utilized the vehicle for a couple of years and it is being to not be reliable. Prior to this vehicle the office utilized one confiscated by the Sheriff's Department. Mr. Jones stated that he would appreciate the committee appropriating funds to purchase a used, reliable vehicle that is a SUV with four-wheel drive for the office to use. He thinks a good vehicle should last the office for at least the next ten (10) years. Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve a \$20,000 budget amendment to the General Fund for the purchase of a used car for the Assessor of Property's office, and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

After discussion, the next meeting was set for Monday, January 4, 2021 following Solid Waste Committee.

There being no further business, Mr. Haston made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to adjourn. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.
