The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, January, 6, 2019, at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Commissioners Roger Mason, Stanley Neal, Robert McCormick and Dale Bennett. Absent were Commissioners Andy Haston, T.K. Austin and Dakota White. Also present were Denny Wayne Robinson, Chad Marcum, Gaylen Barlow and several White Co. residents.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Neal followed by prayer led by Commissioner Mason.

Neal, Chairman asked for review and approval of the Minutes from the December 2, 2019 meeting. After review, Commissioner Mason made a motion to approve the Minutes as presented, motion seconded by Commissioner McCormick, none opposed and motion was approved.

Park & Recreation – Nominations for Parks & Recreation Sub-Committee:

Chairman, Neal reviewed the purpose of establishing a Parks and Rec Sub-Committee and requested updates since last meeting. Commissioner Mason stated that each of the nominated members have agreed to serve on the newly established P&R Committee (for the record, nominees were: Jason McDonald, Marvin Bullock, Diana Haston, Jason Stephenson and Kurt Dronebarger) Commissioner Mason and Commissioner Haston will steer the sub-committee. Mason further stated that members of the P&R Sub-Committee will conduct their first meeting on Monday, February 3, 2020 at 5pm on the 2nd floor of the White County Courthouse.

In other business, Commissioner Bennett reported that a car had ran through the Doyle Softball Field doing damage to the fence, bleachers and the grounds.

Audience member, Mike Wilson, President of the White County Fair was present. Upon approval of members, Chairman Neal requested to allow Mr. Wilson to address the Committee under the current Parks & Recreation topic.

Mr. Wilson expressed concerns with the (rain) water rolling off of Hale Street and flooding the lot at the WC Fairgrounds and Bakers Transmission Shop, located on the lower end of the W.C. Fairgrounds' property. Mr. Wilson receives complaints from Mr. Baker when his property, and inside his business becomes flooded. Wilson sated that Mr. Baker has made many requests that the County or W.C. Fairgrounds do something to ease the pooling of water. Mr. Wilson expressed the history of White County Fairgrounds being free standing and that they (Fair Board) makes every effort to be self-sustaining. However, due to budget restraints and countless efforts to help with the ongoing flooding issue, they (Fair Board) is seeking support from the WC Commission to help ease the flooding problem for, not only the W.C. Fairgrounds, but for Mr.

White County, Tennessee

Baker and his business. He further stated that the flooding wasn't as bad prior to the new Findlay School project, but since completion of that project, there are no ditch lines to divert heavy rain water. Executive Robinson agreed to go by the Fairgrounds and assess the water flow after a heavy rain and see if or how the County should proceed.

White Co. Library Update:

Commissioner Mason, White Co. Library Rep. stated that the Library did not meet in December, therefore, no updates were available.

Approval of White County Roads List 2020:

The 2020 White County Roads list was received by Clay Parker, W.C. Highway Dept. and the Roads List was submitted to the Committee for approval. Commissioner McCormick made a motion to adopt the 2020 County Roads List, seconded by Commissioner Bennett, none opposed and motion was approved.

Census 2020 Update:

Kim England, Executive Assistant is assigned as White County's Census 2020 Coordinator. England updated the Committee about the progress of the CCC (Complete Census Committee). England explained the timeline of the upcoming Census count and requested that each Commissioner help promote and educate the citizens of their districts about the importance of completing and submitting the Census forms. Census forms are scheduled to be mailed by the Federal Census Bureau by mid-March. The actual count is April 1, 2020. England announced the next CCC meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, January 8, 2020 at 12pm at the W.C. Courthouse.

Old Business:

3-Way Stop at Black Oak / Duck Pond Road

Commissioner Neal brought the matter up for discussion at the November meeting and since then spoke to residents in his districts about the need for a 3 Way Stop and safety concerns at Black Oak Rd. / Duck Pond Rd. Commissioner Neal stated that he has spoken with Clay Parker, Highway Dept. and that Mr. Parker had verbally agreed to mark the roads with reflective arrows and possibly a "Slow/Curve" sign to increase safety in that area. A deadline as to when the safety measures would be completed is unknown.

Center Point Acres Lane

Several residents living on Point Lane was present for the meeting and requested to address the Committee with concerns about the condition of the road leading to the seven residences on Point Lane. Each of them expressed their frustration about the half mile of road (Point Lane) not being properly maintained and the challenges they (residents) have had when requesting assistance from the W.C. Highway Dept. Their request has been for the road to be graded and the potholes filled.

Commissioner Mason inquired about the official process of adopting a road within the county. Executive Robinson updated the Committee with information gathered from CTAS and legal sources. Executive Robinson explained that there are TN laws regarding road adoption and establishing classes of roads, however, it would ultimately be up to the Highway Dept. to approve or disapprove a road(s) for classification.

New Business:

No new business was addressed.

Next Scheduled Meetings:

Members of Steering A will meet again on Monday, February 3, 2020 at 5:30 pm in the Executive Conference Room at the White County Courthouse.

Chairman Neal announced that the W.C. Legislative Body will meet in regular session, Monday, January 27, 2020 at 6:00pm on the 3rd Floor at the W.C. Courthouse.

It was noted that the third Monday of January and February are Federal Holidays, therefore, Full Court Meetings will be scheduled for the fourth Monday of January and February.

The HSE (Health & Safety Exploratory) Sub-Committee met on Monday, January 6, 2020 at 5:00pm, in the Executive Conference room at the White County Courthouse.

Call to Order: Commissioner Bobby McCulley, Vice Chairman called the meeting to order. Upon roll call, members present were Commissioners Robert McCormick, Dillard Quick, Bobby McCulley and Executive Denny W. Robinson. Absent was Commissioner T.K. Austin. Audience members included Ron Moses, Sparta Expositor, Commissioners Dale Bennett, Lee Broyles and private citizens.

There being a quorum present, opening prayer was led by Commissioner Robert McCormick.

Approval of Minutes: Denny W. Robinson, Executive made a motion to accept the Minutes from the December 2, 2019 meeting as presented, motion seconded by Commissioner McCormick; none opposed, motion approved.

Updates from Members:

McCulley, Vice Chairman asked members for updates. Executive Robinson recommended that the members of the HSE Committee begin reviewing drafts of *County Powers Acts*, adopted by surrounding areas, line by line and noting any changes or additions that would benefit White County citizens most.

Secondly, it was noted that the White County Legislative Body would have to adopt a *County Powers Act* prior to enforcing property codes.

Further discussions included establishing a *Property Maintenance Board*, if a *Powers Act* were to be approved by the Commission. Executive Robinson suggested that member(s) of the Planning Commission, County Commission and members of the community would serve terms on a Property Maintenance Board. Violations or appeals would be brought to the Property Maintenance Board for hearings and recommendations.

New Business:

The committee members agreed to schedule on-going work-sessions between regular monthly meetings to continue reviewing drafts of the County Powers Acts. The goal of the work sessions will be that members will draft a copy to submit to Steering B in the coming months.

New discussion included the hiring of a Property Maintenance enforcement official. Commissioner Quick recommended starting with a part-time employee initially. Until the final adoption of a Powers Act and Property Maintenance Codes, no decision will be made as to when the position will be filled.

Old Business:

Kim England, Executive Assistant updated members on White County's Building Permit (Issuing Agent) application. It was confirmed by TN Dept. of Commerce and Insurance that the application process may take forty-five - sixty days.

The White County Budget Committee met on Monday, January 6, 2020 following the Steering Committee meetings at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Cain Rogers, Mr. Roger Mason, Mr. Stanley Neal, and Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson. Also present was Mr. Chad Marcum. Absent was Mr. Andy Haston.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Mason.

Mr. Mason asked for approval of the minutes from the December 2, 2019 meeting. Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered four (4) General Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. Sheriff's Department - \$21,066 to reclassify deputy position to SRO (line item adjustment)
- 2.~ Corrections - \$28,800 appropriation for electronic monitoring as per Resolution 37-09-2019
- 3.✓County Buildings - \$47,805 transfer-in of funds remaining at completion of the EMS Building
- 4.✓Health Department - \$78,160 transfer-out of funds for a health department building addition

Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approval all amendments as presented and recommend the passage of amendments 2-4 by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Solid Waste Disposal Fund budget amendment to appropriate funds for the employment of a part-time clerical position at the White County Landfill. Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. Mason seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Capital Projects Fund original budget for Fiscal Year 2020 in the amount of \$125,965. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Rogers seconded the motion to approve the original budget as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered the Fiscal Year 2021 budget preparation calendar. Mr. Robinson made a motion and Mr. Rogers seconded the motion to approve the Fiscal Year 2021 budget preparation calendar as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Mason asked the committee for any old business: There was none.

Mr. Mason asked the committee for any new business:

Mr. Marcum asked the committee to consider a \$4,300 budget amendment to appropriate funds for Hall Income Tax situs audit services for the 2017 tax year. Mr. Marcum explained that the

county was able to capture approximately \$14,000 in Hall Income Tax funds incorrectly distributed to other jurisdictions. Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

After discussion, the next meeting was set for Monday, February 3, 2020 following the Solid Waste Committee.

There being no further business, Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Rogers seconded the motion to adjourn. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Financial Management Meeting

The White County Financial Management Committee met on Wednesday, January 8, 2020 at 12:00 Noon at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Clay Parker, Mr. Bobby McCulley, Mr. Dillard Quick, Mr. Lanny Selby, and Mr. Kurt Dronebarger. Also present was Mr. Chad Marcum. Absent were Mr. Lee Broyles and Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. McCulley.

Mr. McCulley asked for approval of the minutes from the October 9, 2019 meeting. Mr. Quick made a motion and Mr. Selby seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum addressed the committee regarding finance department operations, including payroll tax disbursements and filings as well as sales tax collections. The committee was also informed that Mr. Marcum and Esther Marcum from the Finance Department will be participating in the Certified County Finance Officer (CCFO) program beginning this month. The CCFO program is conducted by the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury and UT County Technical Assistance Service (CTAS). It consists of 11 classes over a 13 month period.

The committee considered a recommendation by the finance and EMS departments to execute a contract extension with Medical Accounts Receivable Systems (dba AMB) for medical billing and accounts receivable collections. The current contract was for three (3) years, and expired on December 31, 2019. This extension would be for an additional three (3) year period, expiring on December 31, 2022. Mr. Parker made a motion and Mr. Selby seconded the motion to recommend passage of the contract extension addendum by the full county commission with a retro-active effective date of January 1, 2020. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a recommendation by the finance department to execute a participating entity addendum with U.S. Bank National Association (US Bank). This is an addendum to the November 1, 2016 contract with the State of Tennessee and US Bank for a corporate credit card program, and will allow White County to participate under the State of Tennessee contract with US Bank. Mr. Dronebarger made a motion and Mr. Parker seconded the motion to recommend passage of the participating entity addendum by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee discussed White County's current travel reimbursement policy as requested by the White County School Board in its December 2019 meeting. Mr. Marcum provided the committee with the current policy and reimbursement rates. After discussion, it was determined that Mr. Marcum would perform a study of other reimbursement policies and rates within Tennessee and report back to the committee. No formal action was taken.

The committee discussed a proposal from Five Points and My Benefits Channel to revamp the county and school system's employee benefits package. The solution proposed would allow Five Points to become the broker for all non-state payroll deductible insurances provided through the county. In return for this, the county would have access to all applications produced by My Benefits Channel. My Benefits Channel provides human resources and cloud based payroll solutions in partnership with Local Government Corporation which provides the accounting software for the White County Finance Department. Mr. Marcum presented a brief overview of the proposal and indicated his openness to the idea, seeing that it would significantly benefit the county's payroll and HR operations. The committee agreed that Mr. Marcum should continue exploring the option and, when appropriate, provide a proposal to the entire committee for review. No formal action was taken.

Mr. McCulley asked the committee for any old business:

Mr. Selby inquired as to the county's implementation of the State of Tennessee Health Insurance Program which began January 1, 2020. Mr. Marcum advised that the transition has went relatively smooth thus far, with only a few minor issues reported.

Mr. McCulley asked the committee for any new business: There was none.

After discussion, it was determined that the next meeting would be set by the Chairman after the results of the travel policy survey were received.

There being no further business, Mr. Dronebarger made a motion and Mr. Parker seconded the motion to adjourn. The motion was approved.

Overcrowding issues are still a factor inside the Correctional Facility. Today's count reflects 202 inmates with 24 of those being state inmates. We continue to move state inmates to prison when beds become available and have sent several to prison or other county jails for housing. Sending 3 state females to the Tennessee Prison for Women on 1/03/2020. We have emailed Mr. Creech about moving more state inmates to the prison but we know that this takes time. Our commissioners are setting lower bonds on certain charges to bond people sooner. We currently have 1 person out on the "Home Detention Program. The ankle monitoring program that was started by the judge and the judicial commissioners has started but so far, no inmate has been placed on the program. We have spoken with the judge about placing more offenders on the program that meets the criteria. However, it depends on the individual's charges and other potential risk factors. This will not immediately solve the overcrowding issue; but this combined with current things being done it may help relieve the pressure and overcrowding in time. As always, we would appreciate any help that TCI and the State can offer.



for the Closure of Sidney Ln**

WHEREAS, the safety and wellbeing of the children in our schools being the top priority, the White County School System has requested that the City of Sparta close Sidney Lane as an important measure in providing for the safety of students at Findlay Elementary; **AND**

WHEREAS, the city has responded to the school's request with an offer granting closure of Sidney Lane, purchase of a baseball field and allowing Hörmann LLC to be added to the sewer agreement between the city and the county in exchange for \$350,000.00 and the County creating and paving 22 additional parking spaces at said baseball field if possible.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the White County Legislative Body, meeting in a regular scheduled meeting, that the county accept the city's offer for closing Sidney Lane as presented in The City of Sparta's Resolution # 19-545 (included as attachment A) subject to the terms and conditions as set forth herein below and in attachment E. The county also accepts the option of prepayment of the remaining balance of \$100,000.00 from the city to the county minus a fifteen percent (15%) discount for prepayment for a total payment of \$85,000.00 which shall be considered the last payment from the city in the Sales Tax Allocation Agreement dated January 16, 2004 (Attachment B) subject to the terms and conditions as set forth herein below and in attachment E thus ending this agreement.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the White County Legislative Body to:

1. Amend the Sales Tax Allocation Agreement (Attachment B), which will end the City's obligations under said agreement.

2. Amend the Local Government Inter-Jurisdictional Wastewater Agreement to extend the boundaries and definition of the industrial park to include but not be limited to the Hörmann LLC Property.
3. Accept as county property the baseball field adjacent to Pearson Park and across from Sparta Electric (part of parcel 059C B 004.00) (Attachment C)
4. Accept Sidney Lane as county property. (Attachment D)
5. Approve the transactions to accomplish the foregoing in the manner set forth in Attachment E.
6. Authorize the County Executive to sign and execute all documents on behalf of White County in order to carry out this Resolution and make said transactions.





WHEREAS, (Part A) it is deemed advantageous for the City of Sparta, TN to offer to White County, TN to relinquish all rights and liabilities to the Baseball field (Parcel 059C B 004.00) adjacent to Pearson Park and across from Sparta Electric and Public Works (see Attachment A), the portion of Sidney Lane, a city street bounded by Hale Street to the West and Meadowbrook Drive to the East (in between the existing Findlay Elementary campus and the new Findlay Elementary campus currently under construction) (**Note: All access and utility easements will remain in effect in favor of both the City and the Cemetery) (see Attachment B), and to amend the Airport Industrial Park Sanitary Sewer System Services Agreement to allow White County, TN the right to collect sewer fees from Hörman Industries in consideration of: (1) \$350,000.00 cash from White County, TN; and (2) White County, TN to construct a total of twenty-two (22) parking spaces including two (2) ADA accessible spaces near the southern edge of the Baseball field property(see Attachment C); and

WHEREAS, (Part B) White County, TN receives annual voluntary contributions from the City of Sparta, TN in the amount of \$50,000.00 for the benefit of the White County Board of Education. There are currently nine (9) voluntary contributions remaining that equal

to \$450,000.00. The City of Sparta will prepay seven (7) voluntary contributions in the amount of \$350,000.00. The City of Sparta will then prepay the final two (2) optional voluntary contributions in the amount of \$100,000.00 minus a fifteen percent (15%) prepayment discount of \$15,000.00 for a total final voluntary contribution of \$85,000.00.





SALES TAX ALLOCATION AGREEMENT

THIS SALES TAX ALLOCATION AGREEMENT (this "Agreement"), dated as of 1/16/04 (the "Effective Date"), by and among White County, Tennessee (the "County") and the City of Sparta (the "City").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on or about 1997, the County issued those certain bonds for the construction of the new White County Middle School with a maturity date of 2014 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated ("T.C.A.") 67-6-712(a)(2)(B), the County is obligated to distribute one-half of all taxes collected pursuant the 1963 Local Option Revenue Act, as amended (the "Revenue Act"), within the city limits of the City to the City (the "City's Share"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to T.C.A. 67-6-712(a)(2)(C), the City by contract can provide for an alternate distribution of some or all of the City's Share; and

WHEREAS, the City desires through a gesture of "goodwill" to now make the voluntary financial contribution specified below to the County for the benefit of the education of the students of White County.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and covenants set forth herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby agreed and acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Section 1. Allocation of the City's Share. During the Term (as defined in Section 2 below), the City, after receiving distribution of the City's Share from the County, shall deliver, on or before June 30th of each consecutive year, in immediately available funds, an amount equal to \$50,000 (the "Contributed Amount"). Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the parties hereto agree that in no instance shall the City be responsible for any past, present or future obligation, allocation or appropriation in connection with the Bonds or any other previous or future bond or other offering by White County except as specifically provided herein, and any such obligations shall only arise upon the Effective Date and continue only for the Term. In addition, the parties hereto acknowledge and agree that the City's maximum obligations hereunder shall not exceed \$1,250,000.

Section 2. Term. Except as provided in Section 7 below, the term (the "Term") of this Agreement shall expire and this Agreement and the terms and conditions hereof (except as otherwise specifically provided herein) shall be of no further force and effect on the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Effective Date of execution of this Agreement.

Section 3. Authorization. Each of the parties hereto represents and warrants that this Agreement and the obligations evidenced hereby has been authorized by proper

resolution, ordinance or other action by each party's governing body, and this Agreement constitutes the valid and binding obligation of each of the parties hereto enforceable against each of the parties in accordance with the terms and conditions hereof.

Section 4. Use of Funds. The County covenants and agrees that the Contributed Amount and any other funds paid to the County by the City hereunder shall be used for the sole purpose of funding educational programs or activities intended to improve school programs or school facilities within White County.

Section 5. No Admissions. Neither this Agreement nor any of the terms herein shall be construed as any admission by the City of the validity of any claims, made or threatened, either past, present, or future, by the County, or of any liability or wrongdoing on the part of the City whatsoever as it relates to any matter or potential matter between the parties involving any bonds or payments due the County either past, present, or future. Neither this Agreement nor any of the terms herein nor any matter or potential matter involving any bonds or payments due the County, either past, present, or future, shall be offered or received in evidence in any action or proceeding, or be utilized in any manner whatsoever, as an admission or concession of liability or wrongdoing of any nature on the part of the City, all of which is denied.

Section 6. Release. In further consideration of the covenants contained herein, the County hereby agrees to unconditionally release and hold the City and its officers, elected officials, agents and employees harmless from any and all claims related directly or indirectly to any and all obligations of the City in connection with the Bonds or any other obligations related to any other bond or other offering by the County arising prior to the Effective Date. This Section 6 shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

Section 7. Change of Law. In the event that (a) the Revenue Act is amended, modified, altered or repealed (including without limitation any non-appealable order or judgment from any court or similar body) such that the City's Share is materially reduced, (b) the City is otherwise prohibited from receiving the City's Share, or (c) this Agreement or the obligations evidenced hereby are no longer permitted by applicable law, this Agreement and the obligations evidenced hereby (except as otherwise specifically provided herein) shall automatically terminate and be of no further force and effect.

Section 8. Notice. In the event that either party desires to give notice to the other party, such notice shall be delivered by: (a) United States mail, certified, return receipt requested, (b) a nationally-recognized overnight courier or (c) hand-delivery. Notices should be sent to the addresses set forth below (or at such other addresses as notified from time to time in writing):

Section 9. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall be deemed a completed instrument.

Section 10. Merger; Modification. This Agreement contains the final and entire understanding of the parties regarding the subject matter hereof, supersedes all prior written and oral agreements, and may be modified only by writing executed by all parties hereto subsequent to the taking of all appropriate governmental action by the respective governing body of each of the parties hereto.

Section 11. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective parties hereto, their respective successors and assigns, beneficiaries, heirs, personal representatives, executors, and administrators.

Section 12. Governing Law. The execution, interpretation, and performance of this agreement shall be governed by the internal laws and judicial decisions of the State of Tennessee without giving effect to the conflict of laws principles thereof.

Section 13. Arbitration. Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement or its breach shall be resolved by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules. The arbitration hearing shall take place in Nashville, Tennessee before a single arbitrator, who shall provide a written explanation of the reasons for any decision. The arbitrator's decision shall be final and binding and may be entered in and enforced by any court having jurisdiction thereof. Arbitration may be commenced at any time by any party hereto giving written notice to each other party to a dispute that such dispute has been referred to arbitration under this Section 13.

To the extent that arbitration for some unforeseen reason may not be legally permitted hereunder, any party may commence a civil action in the Davidson County Circuit Court having jurisdiction and venue for Nashville, Tennessee, which court shall have exclusive jurisdiction, and each party hereby waives any objection to venue based on forum non conveniens or otherwise. Nothing contained in this Section 13 shall prevent the parties from settling any dispute by mutual agreement at any time. This Section 13 shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

Section 14. Assignment. This Agreement and the rights and obligations hereunder may not be assigned by any party without the express written consent of the other parties hereto.

Section 15. Waiver. Any term or provision of this Agreement may be waived at any time by the party entitled to the benefit thereof only by a written instrument duly executed by such party.

Section 16. Severability. Any provision of this Agreement which is invalid or unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall be ineffective to the extent of such invalidity or unenforceability without invalidating or rendering unenforceable the remaining provisions

hereof, and any such invalidity or unenforceability in any jurisdiction shall not invalidate or render unenforceable such provision in any other jurisdiction.

Section 17. Headings. The section headings contained in this Agreement are inserted for convenience only, and shall not affect in any way the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.



Overview of Sparta and White County's Agreement to Close Sidney Ln

1. The City of Sparta is obligated in the amount of \$450,000.00 to the county/school system.
2. The county/school system will pay \$350,000.00 in exchange for:
 - A. The ball field, across from Sparta Electric.
 - B. Sidney Ln.
 - C. Amendment to the waste water contract to include the Hörmann LLC plat/site.
3. This leaves a balance of \$100,000.00 on the city's obligation to the county/school system. This balance will be discounted 15% (\$15,000.00) for early payment leaving a balance of \$85,000.00.
4. Upon approval by the City and the County Legislative Body of the deal; the county and/or school system will write a check to the city for \$350,000.00 for the purchase of the ball field, across from Sparta Electric, Sidney Lane and an amendment to the waste water contract to include but not limited to the Hörmann LLC plat/site; and the city will write a check to the county for \$435,000.00 (which represent the \$450,000.00 minus the \$15,000.00 discount for early payment) thus ending the Sales Tax Allocation Agreement.
5. The county/school system will make a good faith attempt to pave 22 parking spaces (or as close as possible contingent upon enough room to meet ADA or any other requirements) at the ball field as drawn by the city.
6. Both the City and county/school are in agreement that Sidney Lane will be immediately closed to traffic by the City for the safety of Findlay Elementary students.
