A quorum being present the following proceedings were held.

Motion was made by Commissioner Terry Alley and seconded by Commissioner Lee Broyles to approve and spread on minutes the consent calendar. Chairman Rogers called for a voice vote; all members in favor of said motion.

Motion was made by Commissioner Stanley Neal and seconded by Commissioner Lanny Selby to table Resolution 62-11-19 to Establish a Three Way Stop at Duck Pond Road and Black Oak Road in the 7th District. Chairman Rogers called for a voice vote; all members in favor of said motion.

Health & Safety Exploratory Sub-Committee (B) Meeting

The Health & Safety Exploratory Sub-Committee met on Monday, November 4, 2019, in the Executive Conference room at the White County Courthouse.

Call to Order: Commissioner T.K. Austin, Chairman called the meeting to order. Upon roll call, members present were Commissioners Robert McCormick, Dillard Quick, T.K. Austin and Executive Denny W. Robinson. Absent was Commissioner Bobby McCulley. Audience members included four citizens from the community and three other Commissioners. There being a quorum present, opening prayer was led by Commissioner Lanny Selby.

Approval of Minutes: Denny W. Robinson, Executive made a motion to accept the Minutes from the October meeting as presented, seconded by Commissioner McCormick; none opposed and motion was approved.

Updates from Members:

Executive Robinson noted that the costs of Nuisance, Powers Act and/or Building Code Enforcement must be authorized and funded by the full Commission. He suggested that the HSE Committee decide, if they want to move forward with either, or both (Health & Safety and Building Code Enforcement), to request approval and money to do so from the County Commission.

Commissioners Dillard Quick and T.K. Austin discussed the demands and responsibilities that enforcement and monitoring would be for one employee, based on their knowledge and recent research of surrounding counties who have enforcement policies.

Executive Robinson stressed the difference between a Building Codes/Permitting and Health & Safety Issues and noted that, if approved, one employee may not be able to perform the duties of both enforcement entities. Furthermore, Robinson suggested that the Committee request \$80,000.00 (eighty thousand) for startup expenses, i.e. software necessary to issue building permits, operational expenses and salary for codes enforcement to begin operation. Members noted that a portion, if not all of the revenue brought in from permits, citations, etc. would eventually offset the cost of operations.

Commissioner Austin, Chairman entertained a motion to forward a request to Committee B for eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000.00) to cover start-up costs associated with Building Permits/Codes Enforcement. If approved by Committee B, members would forward to the Budget Committee for consideration.

New Business:

Members from the audience were recognized and allowed time to voice concerns. Mr. Steve Carlock, White County resident expressed concerns about the worsening of trash on White County roads, specifically Burgess Falls Road, Old Smithville Hwy, Purvis Holler Road and roads within the northern area of White County. He questioned why more wasn't being done to keep the roadways (County and State) cleaner.

Another audience member presented pictures of her neighbors' "fighting roosters". She stated that she strongly supports the passing of some type of Nuisance law or regulations requiring distances to be enforced.

Steering A Committee Meeting

The White County Steering Committee A met at 5:30pm on Monday, November 4, 2019, in the Executive Conference Room at the White County Courthouse.

Call to Order:

Commissioner Stanley Neal, Chairman announced roll call. All members were present, Commissioners Stanley Neal, Dakota White, Andy Haston, Robert McCormick, Dale Bennett, T.K. Austin and Roger Mason. Also present were Denny Wayne Robinson, Chad Marcum, Gaylen Barlow and citizens of White County, TN. There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Neal and prayer was led by Commissioner Roger Mason.

Approval of Minutes:

Chairman Neal requested review of the Minutes from October 7, 2019. Commissioner White made a motion to approve the Minutes as presented, seconded by Commissioner Austin; the motion was approved unanimously.

Compensation for WCHS Tennis Courts:

Three hundred dollars (\$300) has been requested by Mark Mitchell for mowing the WCHS Tennis Courts for the past several months. Commissioner Cain Rogers allowed Mr. Mitchell to speak to the Committee via conference call where Mitchell explained his volunteer service had begun approximately seven years ago when his child was participating in WCHS Tennis games. Since then, Mitchell and (adult) friends play and/or organize tournaments at the WCHS Tennis Courts and has continued to mow and maintain the overgrowth in/around the fence area. He further stated that mowers that maintain the rest of the grounds mow only up to the courts line and not around the courts (back side of courts). Commissioners questioned why school officials don't mow or maintain the Tennis Courts as they do the basketball courts and school grounds. The Committee decided to table the request until further information was received.

Discussion – 3 Way Stop Black Oak/Duck Pond Road:

Commissioner Neal shared concerns and complaints that he has received from constituents in the 7th District about the right-a-way at Black Oak and Duck Pond Roads (off of 135). Duck Pond Rd ends, without warning, at a sharp curve leading onto Black Oak Rd. Commissioner Mason made a motion to draft a *Resolution* to install 3-Way STOP signs at Duck Pond & Black Oak Roads, motion was seconded by Commissioner White; none opposed and motion was approved unanimously.

Discussion – Center Point Acres:

Commissioner Mason shared concerns and complaints the he has received from constituents from the 6th District, who live on Center Point Acres S and Center Pont Acres N, off of Darky Springs Rd. According to residents and research, both roads were listed as county roads years prior, however, currently the roads are not listed the White County Roads list

provided annually by the Hwy Dept. Commissioner Mason stated that he suspects this was a simple oversight a few years ago when school buses no longer traveled the road(s). Approximately seven (7) residents live on the roads and have postal service, however after complaints from residents and requests from the postal office, the Highway Dept. will occasionally grade and tar/chip the road and then forward the bill to the local postal office requesting payment. According to homeowners, when they purchased their properties, these roads were listed and maintained as county roads and wishes to have the roads reclaimed as such. Commissioner Mason proposed that White County adopt Center Point Acres Road S and Center Pont Acres N as county roads. Commissioner Neal stated that he would do additional research and report back as to the history of Center Point Road(s) and if/when those roads were dropped from the White County Roads List. No action was taken by the Committee. Further conversation tabled until additional research is conducted and information is gathered.

Discussion- Parks & Recreation:

Commissioner Bennett informed the new Commissioners that years ago White County had a Parks & Rec Committee. The former Committee met one time and quickly dissolved. Commissioner Bennett recommended that Committee A approve the formation of a Parks and Rec Board. Commissioner Bennett stated that he had spoken to Mr. Kurt Dronebarger, as well as other citizens within the community, who have expressed interest in serving voluntarily on a County Parks & Rec Board. Members agreed that a Parks & Rec panel would offer many benefits and could help address issues such as maintenance of the ball courts at WCHS, as well as other community events and concerns that arise. Additionally, it was mentioned that grant funding may be possible through a County Parks & Rec Board. Further discussion among members included the makeup of a potential Parks & Rec Sub Committee, Commissioner Bennett noted that that committee should consist of, a minimum of two county Commissioners and the remaining 5-7 members be selected from various professions and areas of the community who would be vetted by a panel nominated by the Commission. Chairman Neal suggested that Parks & Recreation be set up as a Sub-Committee that will make recommendations and report monthly to members of Steering Committee A. A motion was made by Commissioner Bennett to establish a County Parks and Recreation Sub Committee, with a minimum of two Commissioners appointed to serve on the subcommittee, the motion was seconded by Commissioner Haston; none opposed and the motion was approved unanimously.

Chairman Neal suggested that Committee A members come back next month with recommendations of citizens who are willing to volunteer on the Parks & Rec Sub Committee. Commissioners Haston and Mason was appointed by Chairman Neal to steer the Parks & Rec Sub Committee and accept nominations of members.

Community Christmas Celebration:

Executive Robinson notified members that Christ Point Church had requested a monetary donation from the County for this year's Community Tree Lighting service to be held Nov. 30th. Additionally, Christ Point asked if donations received for this specific event could be run through the White County Treasury. Executive Robinson stated that the event was not in the County's jurisdiction and, in his opinion, didn't think the funding should be handled through the County Treasury. Without a clear description of what monetary donations would be used for, or what specific expenses are associated with the Lighting of the Tree event, the Committee denied the request for a monetary donation.

The White County Steering Committee B met on Monday, November 4, 2019, at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Lanny Selby, Dillard Quick, Cain Rogers, and Terry Alley. Also present were Denny Wayne Robinson, Chad Marcum, Kurt Dronebarger, Suzi Cash Haston, and Steve Carlock. Absent were Bobby McCulley, Lonnie Crouch, and Lee Broyles.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Lanny Selby and prayer was led by Terry Alley.

Lanny Selby asked for approval of the minutes from the previous meeting. Cain Rogers made a motion and Terry Alley seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was approved by all members.

Update from Health & Safety Exploratory Sub-Committee:

Dillard Quick advised members the Health and Safety Sub-Committee requested \$80,000 be budgeted for a Health and Safety Inspector due to concerns in the county. Mr. Quick further advised that Health and Safety Sub-Committee voted to send the matter to Steering Committee B for review. Dillard Quick made a motion and Cain Rogers seconded the motion to send the matter to Budget Committee. Denny Wayne Robinson explained the concerns of county residents of no enforcement of building codes, trash, etc. Mr. Quick discussed the procedure of setting up a position for Building Codes Inspector and enforcement. Members voted on the motion, at which time all approved and the motion was passed.

Discussion of EMA:

Denny Wayne Robinson stated that EMA is currently a volunteer position and there is a need for a paid employee (EMA Director). Suzi Haston discussed available grants for which the county has applied. Ms. Haston advised that part of the EMA position would include various training in the county, as well as obtaining equipment and working with TEMA. Ms. Haston advised the state may also help fund the salary through a grant. Terry Alley made a motion and Dillard Quick seconded the motion to send the matter to Budget Committee to fund an EMA Director. Mr. Robinson stated that E-911 was willing to split the salary and position with the county. Ms. Haston discussed how other counties work EMA. Members voted on the motion, at which time all approved and the motion was passed.

Discussion of Sydney Lane:

Denny Wayne Robinson advised the Board of Ed wishes to close Sydney Lane for the new Findlay Elementary School. Kurt Dronebarger told members they planned to use the existing playground at Findlay Elementary rather than have the expense of building another. Mr. Dronebarger discussed the need to close Sydney Lane, put up a fence, and build sidewalks. That would then become the property of the Board of Ed. Mr. Robinson advised the county is awaiting a written offer from the city's attorney. Mr. Robinson stated the city owes the Board of Ed \$450,000 per a prior agreement,

which also gave permission for Hörmann, LLC to tie into the sewer line on Airport Road. Mr. Robinson stated the city wants the county to purchase the ballpark next to Pearson Park for \$350,000 and pave 25 parking spaces there. Mr. Robinson stated that would be taken off the amount due to the Board of Ed plus a 15% discount to pay the remaining balance early. Terry Alley made a motion and Dillard Quick seconded the motion to send the matter to full court, contingent upon the finalized paperwork being submitted by the City of Sparta. The motion was approved by all members and passed.

Building Permits Update:

Dillard Quick stated the need to fund Health and Safety first. Denny Wayne Robinson advised permits will be done temporarily out of the County Executive office. No further action was taken and the matter was tabled.

Steve Carlock told commissioners that the Code Enforcement Officer should be backed by the County and discussed funding the officer.

Mr. Carlock also discussed the matter of EMA and suggested partnering with other counties to help with grants.

Chairman Selby advised there will be a work session Thursday, November 7, at 6:30 pm so one of the commissioners and Mr. Dronebarger may discuss the sales tax matter for the county and its needs.

There being no further business, Dillard Quick made a motion and Terry Alley seconded the motion to adjourn. The motion was approved by all members.

Solid Waste Committee Meeting

The White County Solid Waste Committee met on Monday, November 4, 2019, in the Executive Conference Room at the White County Courthouse. Immediately following Steering Committee A.

Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Roger Mason and opened with a roll call. Members present were Commissioners Stanley Neal, Dakota White, Andy Haston, T.K. Austin, Robert McCormick, Dale Bennett and Roger Mason. With none absent, a quorum was present and business proceeded. Also, present were County Executive Denny Wayne Robinson, Finance Director Chad Marcum and Solid Waste Director, Gaylen Barlow.

Approval of Minutes:

Chairman Mason requested review and discussion of Minutes from the October meeting. Commissioner McCormick made a motion to approve the Minutes as presented, seconded by Commissioner White; none opposed and motion carried.

Director's Report:

Solid Waste Director, Gaylen Barlow updated the Committee on the day-to-day operations of the White County Landfill. Barlow informed members of the excessive amount of tires that have been coming in at the Landfill. Approximately 300 tires have come into the landfill within a week from a local business that is not a tire dealer, leaving the County to pay the disposal fees. Barlow stated this has been an ongoing issue and is seeking a solution to ease the influx of tire disposals. Members discussed imposing a per tire fee for anything over four (tires), per person to offset the costs of disposal. The county is charged per pound when Liberty Tire picks up the trailers from the Landfill to haul off for disposal. Commissioner Neal made a motion to impose a charge of one dollar (\$1.00) per tire, for any Commercial Business, **excluding White County Tire Dealers** (i.e. Bailey Tires, WC Tire, Luna & Son, CO-OP, etc.) who dispose of tires at the White Co. Landfill, seconded by Commissioner McCormick. None opposed and motion was approved.

Engineer's Report:

Executive Robinson presented an update on the Well Monitoring permit and amendment to Class 3 permit. Executive Robinson stated that an invoice had been received for the Well Monitoring. Additionally, he has been in contact with the Engineer and working to amend the Class 3 permit to allow additional space for Class 3 waste.

Old Business:

None

New Business:

Executive Robinson discussed options of closing the Landfill on Saturday for general business, but considering re-opening the Convenient Center, at the entrance of Landfill, that has been closed for the past few years. Executive Robinson recommended that operations, for that particular Convenient Center, be on the same (Saturday) schedule that the Landfill currently operates. Further discussion included the staffing demands of re-opening the Convenient Center, closer inspection needed of the waste being brought in and what, if anything can be done to ensure that everyone is going across the scale and paying to dump loads, if required. Commissioners Mason and McCormick suggested that the Landfill “tighten up” on enforcement and monitoring of those who come in to dispose of waste. Further discussion about potential costs of re-opening and operating the Convenient Center vs expanding the staff and training of Landfill staff in an effort to consistently and fairly charge for loads. Executive Robinson agreed to present data at next month’s meeting that will compare costs and outline pros vs cons of re-opening the Convenient Center. No action was taken on the matter and discussion was tabled until next month.

In other business, Executive Robinson recommended that Tipping fees, at the Landfill, be increased. The current Tipping fee is forty one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$41.25) per ton and has been locked at that rate for years. Executive Robinson further stated that the rate is approximately sixty dollars (\$60.00) per ton in other counties. After brief discussions, Commissioner Neal made a motion to increase Tipping fees to fifty one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$51.25) per ton (a ten dollar (\$10) per ton increase), motion seconded by Commissioner Austin, none opposed. After open discussion, Commissioner Neal made a motion to amend the motion to include January 1, 2020 as the effective date for the Tipping fee increase; the amended motion was seconded by Commissioner Haston, none opposed and motion was approved.

Next Meeting:

Chairman Mason announced the next Solid Waste Committee meeting will be Monday, December 2, 2019 immediately following Steering Committee A meeting, in the Executive Conference Room, at the White County Courthouse.

Adjourn:

There being no further business, Commissioner Austin made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Commissioner Bennett. None opposed, motion to adjourn approved.

RESOLUTION NO: 63-11-2019

RESOLUTION TO INCREASE TIPPING FEE AT SOLID WASTE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS; it is the duty of the County Commission to take all actions possible and necessary to efficiently provide certain services to the citizens of White County, and

WHEREAS; the disposal of solid waste and debris is a major concern to all residents and is an important factor to the economic development and continued growth of White County, and

WHEREAS; the County Commission must constantly monitor and adjust the operation of Solid Waste Department to ensure it is operating at maximum efficiency, thus guaranteeing the best service to White County with minimal associated cost to tax payers.

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED; That the White County Commission meeting in a regular scheduled meeting do hereby set forth and adjust the Tipping Fee for Solid Waste from forty-one dollars and twenty-five cents (\$41.25) to fifty-one dollars and twenty five cents (\$51.25) per ton. This fee includes the one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25) fee charged by the State.

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED; the new user fees shall take effect January 1, 2020, after passage by County Legislative Body, the public's health and wellbeing dependent on it.

Motion made by Robert McCormick and seconded by Larry Selby that the above resolution be adopted.





RESOLUTION 67-11-2019

AUTHORIZING LEVY OF ADDITIONAL SALES AND USE TAX

WHEREAS, the official tax rate of the county is the number used by the State of Tennessee to determine the equitable division of sales tax revenue in White County and the cities within White County, and;

WHEREAS, The State of Tennessee recognizes the official tax rate as 2.25%, the rate set by White County, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Sparta, by referendum, has raised the city's sales tax rate by 0.5% to 2.75% thus surpassing the county's official rate, and;

WHEREAS, the County Commission, in an attempt to avoid confusion and to ensure the continuation of equitable distribution of tax revenue for the benefit of ALL citizens residing within White County and its Cities, deems it judicious that the sales and use tax rate be consistent and equal across the county.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the White County Legislative Body hereby propose an 0.5% increase in local option sales and use tax and furthermore request the White County Election Commission to authorize the referendum on the **Presidential Preference Primary**, as called for in section 2, allowing the option to vote "For" or "Against" on the ballot. The Ballot shall read "Shall Resolution No. 67-11-2019 passed by the White County Commission which increases the local sales tax rate from 2.25% to 2.75% become operative?"

SECTION 1. The resolution of the county legislative body of White County, Tennessee, imposing a local sales and use tax as authorized under the provisions of *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Sections 67-6-701 through 67-6-712, adopted by the county legislative body at a regular meeting of record in **Minute Book 58, page 196**, is amended to levy a local sales and use tax at a rate of 2.75%, not to exceed the maximum percentage as stated in the RETAILERS TAX ACT, *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-6-702, as amended, except as limited or modified by statute.

SECTION 2. If a majority of those voting in the **Presidential Preference Primary** required by *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 67-6-706, vote for the increase in the tax imposed by this resolution, collection of the increased tax levied by this resolution shall begin on the first day of the month occurring thirty (30) or more days after the county election commission makes its official canvass of the election returns.

SECTION 3. The Department of Revenue of the State of Tennessee shall collect the additional tax imposed by this Resolution concurrent with the collection of the state tax and the local tax now being

the collection of the additional tax imposed by this Resolution, and to provide in the contract that the department may deduct from the tax collected a reasonable amount or percentage to cover the expense of the administration and collection of the tax.

SECTION 5. In the event the tax is collected by the Department of Revenue, suits for the recovery of any tax illegally assessed or collected shall be brought against the state Commissioner of Revenue and the White County Executive.

SECTION 6. A certified copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Department of Revenue by the County Clerk forthwith and shall be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in White County prior to the election called for in Section 2.
