BE IT REMEMBERED THAT THE WHITE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY met in regular session at the White County Courthouse in Sparta, Tennessee on September 16, 2019 at 6:00 p.m.

Present and residing the Hon. Cain Rogers, Chairman, Denny Wayne Robinson, County Executive, and Sasha Wilson, County Clerk, also present Chad Marcum, Finance Director and John Meadows, County Attorney, with the following Commissioners present: Lanny Selby, Terry Alley, Dale Bennett, Lonnie Crouch, Dillard Quick, Stanley Neal, Dakota White, Bobby McCulley, Roger Mason, and Andy Haston. Absent: Lee Broyles, Robert McCormick, and T.K Austin.

A quorum being met the following proceedings were held.

Motion was made by Commissioner Bobby McCulley and seconded by Commissioner Dakota White to Approve and Spread on Minutes Consent Calendar. Chairman Neal called for a voice vote; all members in favor of said motion.

The White County *Nominating Committee* met on Monday, September 09, 2019 at 5:30pm at the White County Courthouse, Executive Conference Room. Prayer was led by Commissioner Stanley Neal. A roll call was conducted of the junior Commissioners serving as the Nominating Committee for the 2020 term. Members present were Commissioners Andy Haston, T.K. Austin, Dillard Quick, Dakota White, Bobby McCulley, Lonnie Crouch and Denny Wayne Robinson. None absent. Senior members in attendance were CC Chairman, Stanley Neal, Dale Bennett, Terry Alley and Lanny Selby.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by County Executive Denny Robinson. Mr. Robinson opened the floor for nominations for Chairman of the *Nominating Committee*. T.K. Austin nominated Roger Mason as Chairman. There were no other nominations or discussion, therefore Dakota White made a motion and Bobby McCulley seconded the motion that all nominations cease and Roger Mason be elected by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members present voted in favor. The motion was approved, **Commissioner Roger Mason accepted appointment as Chairman of Nominating Committee** for the 2020 term.

**Chairman Roger Mason** opened the floor for nominations for Secretary of *Nominating Committee*. Dakota White nominated Dillard Quick as Secretary. There were no other nominations, therefore T.K. Austin made a motion and Lonnie Crouch seconded the motion that all nominations cease and Dillard Quick be elected by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members present voted in favor. The motion was approved. **Commissioner Dillard Quick will serve as Secretary of the Nominating Committee** for the 2020 term.

Chairman Roger Mason opened the floor for nominations for the *Budget Committee*. Dillard Quick nominated Roger Mason, Dakota White nominated Stanley Neal and Roger Mason nominated Andy Haston. There were no other nominations therefore T.K. Austin made a motion and Dakota White seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Roger Mason, Stanley Neal, Andy Haston** were nominated to serve **with the Chairman of CC and Executive Denny Wayne Robinson as the Budget Committee** for the 2020 term.

The committee considered *Financial Management Committee* appointments. Roger Mason nominated Bobby McCulley, Dakota White nominated Lanny Selby, TK Austin nominated Lee Broyles and Bobby McCulley nominated Dillard Quick. There were no other nominations therefore T.K. Austin made a motion and Lonnie Crouch seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Bobby McCulley, Lanny Selby, Lee Broyles and Dillard Quick nominated**

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to serve with **CC Chairman, WC School Superintendent and Executive Robinson** as the *Financial Management Committee* for the 2020 term.

The committee considered *Audit Committee* appointments. T.K. Austin made a motion to appoint the same members of the Budget Committee to serve the Audit Committee, seconded by Lonnie Crouch, with the addition of one community representative, who will be appointed by Executive Robinson. There were no other nominations, therefore Dakota White made a motion and T.K. Austin seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Roger Mason, Stanley Neal and Andy Haston** were nominated by the Committee to serve with **the CC Chairman and one community representative as the Audit Committee** for the 2020 term.

Chairman Roger Mason opened the floor for nominations for the *Purchasing Committee*. Dakota White nominated Lonnie Crouch, T.K. Austin nominated Lanny Selby and Lonnie Crouch nominated T.K. Austin. There were no other nominations therefore Dakota White made a motion and Andy Haston seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Lonnie Crouch, T.K. Austin and Lanny Selby** were nominated to serve **with CC Chairman, Executive Robinson and Department Heads as the Purchasing Committee** for the 2020 term.

The committee considered *Steering Committee A* appointments. After brief discussions, the members agreed unanimously to re-assign the Commissioners serving on Steering Committee A for the 2019 term, to Steering Committee B for the 2020 term. There were no other discussion or nominations, therefore Bobby McCulley made a motion and Lonnie Crouch seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the following members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Stanley Neal, Dale Bennett, Dakota White, T.K. Austin, Andy Haston, Robert McCormick and Roger Mason** were nominated to serve as *Steering Committee A* for the 2020 term.

After agreeing unanimously to re-assign the Commissioners serving on **Steering Committees A & B**, There were no other nominations or discussion, therefore T.K. Austin made a motion and Andy Haston seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the following members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Cain Rogers, Terry Alley, Dillard Quick, Bobby McCulley, Lanny Selby, Lonnie Crouch and Lee Broyles** were nominated to serve as **Steering Committee B for the 2020 term**.

Chairman Roger Mason opened the floor for nominations for the *Solid Waste Committee*. Bobby McCulley recommended new members for the Solid Waste Committee. After brief discussion, T.K. Austin made a motion that the same (2019) members of the Solid Waste Committee remain on Committee during the 2020 term. Dillard Quick seconded the motion. On a voice call vote, members Andy Haston, Roger Mason, T.K. Austin, Dillard Quick, Lonnie Crouch and Dakota White voted in favor of the motion. Bobby McCulley opposed. Motion carried. **Commissioners Dale Bennett, Robert**

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**McCormick, Roger Mason, T.K. Austin, Andy Haston and Dakota White** were nominated to serve as members of the **Solid Waste Committee** for the 2020 term.

Chairman Roger Mason opened the floor for nominations for the **Beer Board**. Dakota White nominated Lanny Selby, Roger Mason nominated Bobby McCulley and T.K. Austin nominated Robert McCormick. There were no other nominations therefore Dakota White made a motion and Andy Haston seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the members be recommended by acclamation. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Lanny Selby, Bobby McCulley and Robert McCormick** were nominated to serve at the **Beer Board** for the 2020 term.

Chairman Roger Mason opened the floor for nominations for the **Agriculture Committee**. Dakota White nominated Bobby McCulley, Bobby McCulley nominated T.K. Austin and Roger Mason nominated Lonnie Crouch. T.K. Austin made a motion and Dakota White seconded the motion that all nominations cease and the members be recommended by acclamation. On a roll call vote, all members voted in favor, the motion was approved. **Commissioners Bobby McCulley, T.K. Austin and Lonnie Crouch** were nominated to serve as the **Agriculture Committee** for the 2020 term.

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## **Steering A Committee**

### **Meeting Minutes**

The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, September 9, 2019, at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Cain Rogers, Lanny Selby, Dillard Quick, Terry Alley, Lonnie Crouch, Lee Broyles, and Bobby McCulley. Also present was Chad Marcum.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Chairman Cain Rogers and prayer was led by Lanny Selby.

Cain Rogers asked for approval of the minutes from the previous meeting. Bobby McCulley made a motion and Lee Broyles seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. All members approved and the motion was passed.

#### County Speed Limits:

Terry Alley said a citizen complained about road signs that had been put back up incorrectly by the Highway Department after being knocked down, destroyed, or stolen. Mr. Alley advised that the citizen wanted the signs fixed to the way they were before. Mr. Alley was unsure of the citizen's name and road but said the citizen had also contacted the County Executive's office about the matter. Members stated someone would check with Denny Wayne Robinson about the matter. No further action was taken.

#### Wheel Tax Allocations:

Chad Marcum discussed how the Wheel Tax helps supplement the county and school's health insurance. He informed that in the 2019 fiscal year the county spent more on insurance than what was made by the Wheel Tax, which caused a deficit in the Highway fund and General Purpose School fund. Mr. Marcum, along with the Financial Management Committee, recommended that for the 2020 fiscal year the county reallocate surplus funds from the General Fund reserve to balance the health insurance deficit. Mr. Marcum advised that would make the General Fund 6%, Highway 18%, and General Purpose School 76%. Then for the 2021 fiscal year the amounts would change to the General Fund 43%, Highway 7%, and GP School 50%. Terry Alley made a motion and Lanny Selby seconded the motion to send the recommendation to Budget Committee. All members approved and the motion was passed.

#### Old Business:

##### Quebeck Baptist Church Property Update:

Members discussed the matter and the condition of the property at Quebeck Baptist Church. No action was taken.

Members discussed the country club golf course request and did not feel the county should provide them with financial assistance. No further action was taken.

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Some of the members discussed a previous suggestion by Lee Broyles to create a disc golf course for the county and Dillard Quick said he thought it was a good idea. No further action was taken.

*New Business:*

Chad Marcum mentioned the basketball courts' lighting is being taken care of and resurfacing needs to be considered. No further action was taken.

There being no further business, Dillard Quick made a motion and Lee Broyles seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was approved.

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## **Steering B Committee Meeting**

The White County Steering Committee B met on Monday, September 9, 2019, at the White County Courthouse. Members present were **Chairman Stanly Neal, Andy Haston, Robert McCormick, Dakota White, Roger Mason, T.K. Austin and Dale Bennett**. Also present were Executive Denny Robinson, two citizens of White County and Kim England, Executive Assistant.

There being a quorum present, Chairman Stanley Neal called the meeting to order and Commissioner Roger Mason led members in prayer.

## **Approval of Minutes**

Chairman Neal asked for approval of the minutes from the previous meeting. Commissioner Dakota White made a motion to approve the minutes as presented and Commissioner Andy Haston seconded, none opposed. Motion approved.

Executive Robinson submitted copies of the EMI (Electronic Monitoring Indigency) Fund Memorandum of Understanding that White County will enter into with the State of Tennessee. White County will agree to a 50/50 share plan with the State of TN to provide electronic monitoring devices for low risk offenders in an effort to elevate overcrowding in the White County Jail. The approximate cost to White County will be \$28,800 for fiscal year 2019-2020 and will be paid from the WCSD fund, not the General Fund. Commissioner Austin made a motion to move a Resolution to the County Commission Full Court for consideration. Motion was seconded by Commissioner McCormick. On a voice call vote, all members voted in favor of the motion and approved. Resolution for Local Government Participation in the Electronic Monitoring Indigency Fund will move to the full court.

Executive Robinson updated the Committee on a recent meeting in Nashville, TN with members of the TCI (Tennessee Corrections Institute) in reference to TCI's Notification of Inspection Findings Requiring a Plan of Action for White County Jail. In addition to the meeting, Executive Robinson and Sherriff Steve Page also submitted rapid responses, in writing to TCI, outlining the efforts being made to combat the overcrowding issue. The EMI (Electronic Monitoring Indigency program is one example of such effort.

## **Chairman Neal opened the floor for old business**

Chairman Neal requested an update and further discussion of the *County Powers Act* and opened the floor for discussion. After brief discussion, Commissioner Mason suggested that a sub-committee be formed to continue researching best practices, develop a plan outlining codes, ordinances, enforcement, etc. Commissioner Neal made a motion to form a "Health & Safety Exploratory Committee" and opened the floor for discussion and recommendations to serve on "Health & Safety Exploratory Committee". The motion to form a "Health & Safety Exploratory Committee" was seconded by Commissioner Mason, none opposed and motion was approved. After further discussion, Commissioner Mason made a motion

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to amend the previous motion and suggested that the "Health & Safety Exploratory Committee" consist of two (2) members from Steering Committee A and two (2) members from Steering Committee B; Commissioners T.K. Austin and R. McCormick from Steering A, and D. Quick and B. McCulley from Steering B volunteered to serve on sub-committee. Motion to amend and accept members was seconded by Commissioner Austin. After further discussion Commissioner Austin made a motion to add the County Executive to the "Health & Safety Exploratory Committee", seconded by Commissioner White. Being no further discussion Chairman Neal asked for a vote on the amendments, none opposed. Motion approved. Chairman Neal then called for the vote on the original motion as amended; to form a "Health & Safety Exploratory Committee" composed of two (2) members from Steering Committee A (Austin and McCormick), two (2) members from Steering Committee B (Quick and McCulley) and the County Executive. Motion passed with all members voting in favor.

### **Chairman Neal opened the floor for new business**

There was no New Business.

The next Steering B Committee meeting was scheduled for **Monday, October 1st at 5:30pm, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of WC Courthouse in the Executive Conference Room.**

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner White; with none opposed, and motion was approved.

The White County Solid Waste Committee met on Monday, September 9, 2019 immediately following the Steering Committee B meeting at the White County Courthouse. Commissioners present were **Andy Haston, Robert McCormick, Dakota White, Dale Bennett, Roger Mason and Stanley Neal**. Also present were **Finance Director Chad Marcum, Landfill Director Gaylon Barlow and County Executive Denny Robinson**. Minutes recorded by **Kim England, Executive Assistant**.

### **Call to Order:**

The Items to Surplus list was presented to the Committee by Chad Marcum. Chairman Bennett open the floor for discussion. Commissioner Dakota White made a motion to send Resolution of Items to Surplus to Full Court; motion was seconded by Commissioner Roger Mason; none opposed and motion was approved.

### **Chairman asked the committee for any old business:**

There was no old business.

### **Chairman asked the committee for any new business:**

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Director Barlow stated that the Landfill was in desperate need of a Roll-Off truck to be used on route pick-ups. Barlow has priced a used truck at a reasonable price. Upon Barlow's request, Executive Robinson proposed the purchase of a Roll-Off truck for the Landfill for \$50,000. After brief discussion, the Committee determined that the purchase could be made at the discretion of Director Barlow and Executive Robinson without Committee approval since the Solid Waste Budget had been approved for the 2019-2020 year. The purchase of a truck would be drawn from the Solid Waste account.

There being no further business, Commissioner T.K. Austin made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Commissioner Mason; with none opposed motion approved; meeting adjourned.

Mr. Rogers asked for approval of the minutes from the August 5, 2019 meeting. Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered two (2) School Federal Projects Fund original budgets for Fiscal Year 2020 as follows:

1. Title IV Part B (21<sup>st</sup> Century Program), Subfund 431: \$312,794.00
2. Title IV Part B (21<sup>st</sup> Century Program), Subfund 432: \$196,900.00

Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Quick seconded the motion to approve the original budgets as presented, contingent upon White County School Board approval. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered two (2) Capital Projects Fund original budgets for Fiscal Year 2020 as follows:

1. Fund 176 – Highway Capital Projects Fund; \$1,760,000
2. Fund 177 – Education Capital Projects Fund; \$7,184,794

Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the original budgets as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a School Federal Projects Fund budget amendment in the amount \$36,084 for Subfund 901, to correct an original budget coding error for salaries. Mr. Quick made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered five (5) General Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. Litter Control/Grant: \$2,000 for reclassification of vehicle fuel (line item adjustment)
2. Industrial Development: \$395,000 for Airport Road Waterline Relocation (ARC Grant)
3. EMS: \$112,741 for power cots purchase (FEMA – Assistance to Firefighters Grant)
4. Industrial Development: \$50,000 for BIZ Foundry Rehabilitation (TN ECD Grant)
5. Three Star Grant: \$50,000 for Three Star Workforce Development (TN ECD Grant)

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Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Quick seconded the motion to approve all amendments as presented and recommend the passage of amendments 2-5 by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered two (2) Drug Control Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. Drug Control Communication: \$1,200 that was left out of original budget in error
2. Drug K-9 Program: \$20,000 for additional funds needed to operate the K-9 program

Mr. Quick made a motion and Mr. Mason seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Highway/Public Works Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$362,034 for the replacement of a bridge on Jared Road over a branch. Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered two (2) Solid Waste Disposal Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. Used Oil Grant - \$61,000 for used oil heaters and tanks at various locations
2. Leachate Sump Construction - \$76,554 for completion of sump construction

Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendments as presented and recommend their passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Coming from Steering Committee A, the committee considered a plan to re-allocate the distribution percentages of the wheel tax for employee health insurance costs. Mr. Marcum explained to the committee that Fiscal Year 2019 marked the first year that, as a whole, the county spent more on health insurance than was received in wheel tax funds. Currently there is a surplus of wheel tax funds in the General Fund that has built up over previous years, while the Highway and General Purpose School Funds have seen deficits in the prior three fiscal periods. The proposal coming from Steering Committee A is to reallocate funds for Fiscal Year 2020, in an effort to eliminate the prior year deficits seen in the Highway and General Purpose School Funds. The distribution would be 6% General Fund, 18% Highway Fund, 76% GP Schools Fund for FY 2020. Beginning July 1, 2020 the percentages would again change to align with the enrollment and would be 43% General Fund, 7% Highway Fund, and 50% GP Schools Fund. After discussion, Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Quick seconded the motion to approve the proposal as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. Mr. Neal and Mr. Mason commented that their spouses were enrolled in the health insurance funded in part by the wheel tax, but that their vote was not affected by this. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Rogers asked the committee for any old business: There was none.

Mr. Rogers asked the committee for any new business: There was none.

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After discussion, the next meeting was set for Monday, October 7, 2019 following Solid Waste Committee.

There being no further business, Mr. Mason made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to adjourn. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.







# Debt Management

## 5.1 Purposes and uses of Debt

White County will only use debt to fund capital projects which have estimated cost beyond what is capable of funding within the normal operating budget.

## 5.2 Project life

The projected life span of any project should exceed five years. When preparing debt instruments, the term of the obligation should not exceed the life span of the project being funded.

## 5.3 Acceptable Types of Debt

White County will use the following debt instruments when issuing new debt:

1. General Obligation Bonds
2. Revenue Bonds
3. Capital Outlay Notes
4. Interfund Loans

## 5.4 Debt Capacity

There are no legal debt limits for White County bonds or notes. Section 9-21-103 of the laws of Tennessee provides that bonds or notes may be issued without regard to any limit on indebtedness for Tennessee Counties. While state law does not legally bind White County, it is the governing body's policy not to incur debt beyond ten percent (10%) of the assessed value of property on the tax rolls.

## 5.5 Short term Notes

White County will prepare and sell short term notes to fund reoccurring capital expenditures such as vehicles and equipment. The length of these notes should not exceed eight (8) years.

## 5.6 Interfund Loans

Due to the tax structure, White County may implement Interfund loans to cover shortages in revenue until such time that the taxes are due and payable. Any loans of this nature must be repaid by June 30<sup>th</sup> of the current budget cycle. Department head approval must be obtained prior to transfer of funds.

## 5.7 Bonded Debt & Derivative Policy

1. Introduction

The purpose of this policy (this "Policy") is to establish guidelines for the use by White County, Tennessee (the "Issuer") of fixed and variable rate bonded debt (collectively "Bonded

Debt”) to finance capital projects and the use of various interest rate hedging instruments and other swaps, caps, options, basis swaps, rate locks, total return swaps and other similar products (collectively, “Swap Products”) to help manage and optimize the risk/rewards of the Issuer’s Bonded Debt portfolio. This Policy confirms the commitment of the Board of Commissioners (the “Board”), management, staff and advisors to adhere to sound financial and risk management practices. It is expected that this Policy will be formally approved by the Board and updated periodically.

## 2. Rationale for Using Swap Products

The Board recognizes that Bonded Debt and certain Swap Products can be appropriate financial management tools. This Policy sets forth the manner in which the Issuer shall enter into Bonded Debt transactions and any transactions involving Swap Products (“Swap Transactions”). The Issuer shall integrate this Policy and any resulting Bonded Debt or Swap Transactions into its overall debt and investment management programs in a prudent manner in accordance with the parameters set forth in this Policy.

Rationale for the use of Bonded Debt includes, but is not limited to:

- Raise capital to adequately finance improvements, expansions and replacement of the Issuer’s facilities, including the acquisition of technology and equipment
- Properly finance long lived assets with similar average life liabilities
- Minimize the use of the Issuer’s liquid assets for future needs, liquidity, cash reserves and investment opportunities
- Maximize the Issuer’s future borrowing capacity
- Maintain flexibility for the Issuer to fulfill its long term mission

For fixed rate Bonded Debt this includes, but is not limited to:

- Obtain permanent long term funding without any of the risk associated with variable rate debt or synthetic financial products
- Properly maintain a balanced mix of different liability instruments in the Issuer’s overall debt portfolio
- Diversify holders of the Issuer’s debt

For variable rate Bonded Debt this includes, but is not limited to:

- Reduce interest cost by accessing the short end of the yield curve
- Increase financial flexibility
- Diversify holders of the Issuer’s debt
- Properly maintain a balanced mix of different liability instruments in the Issuer’s overall debt portfolio
- Help manage the Issuer’s overall asset-to- liability balance sheet
- Help build cash reserves from interest cost savings

Rationales for the use of Swap Products and the execution of Swap Transactions include, but are not limited to:

- Hedge or actively manage interest rate, tax, basis, legal, regulatory and other risks;
- Enhance the relationship between risk and return with respect to debt or investments;
- Optimize the Issuer's capital structure;
- Achieve an appropriate match of assets and liabilities;
- 
- Synthetically introduce fixed or variable rate exposure;
- Lock in current fixed rates for future use, including synthetically advance refunding debt that cannot be refunded with a conventional cash-market issuance;
- Access the capital markets more rapidly than may be possible with conventional debt instruments;
- Provide a higher level of savings, lower level of risk, greater flexibility, or other direct benefits not available in the cash market;
- Manage the Issuer's exposure to the risk of changes in the legal and regulatory tax treatment of tax-exempt bonds (e.g., income tax rate changes);
- Manage the Issuer's credit exposure to financial institutions and other entities; and
- Achieve more flexibility in meeting overall financial objectives than can be achieved in conventional markets.

Swap Products may be used by the Issuer to achieve a specific objective consistent with its overall debt and investment management policy, but they shall not be used for speculation, as the Issuer shall not assume risks through the use of Swap Products that would not be considered prudent in light of the above-stated rationales. The Issuer recognizes that changes in the capital markets or, the Issuer's programs, and other unforeseen circumstances may from time to time produce circumstances that are not contemplated by this Policy and shall require modifications or exceptions to achieve the Issuer's goals. In these cases, management flexibility is appropriate, provided that specific authorization from the Board is obtained prior to any action.

### 3. Permitted Instruments

The Issuer expects to utilize the following, or similar, Swap Products, each of which is a two-party agreement between the Issuer and a counterparty:

- *Interest Rate Swaps:* An agreement to exchange periodic payments based upon changes in rates over a period of time. Cash flows are calculated based on a fixed or floating rate against a set "notional" amount (amount used only for calculation of payments) and may begin on a current or forward basis. Principal is not exchanged.

- *Options on Swaps (Swaptions)*: An agreement in which one party has the right, but not the obligation, to enter into, cancel or modify a predetermined swap with the other party on a future date or dates or during a specific period.
- *Basis Swaps*: A floating-to-floating interest rate swap in which one floating rate is exchanged for another.
- *Rate Locks*: A form of interest rate swap with a single cash flow, which is most often used to hedge, though not necessarily reduce, the interest cost of an upcoming fixed rate issue.
- *Interest Rate Caps, Collars, Floors*: A financial contract under which the counterparty, in exchange for charging a set premium, will make payments to the Issuer insofar as the specified interest rate either exceeds a specified strike rate or, in the case of a floor, is less than a specified strike rate.

Other Swap Products shall be permitted at the discretion of the Board.

#### 4. Risk Analysis

Prior to entering into any Swap Transaction, the Issuer shall consider the risks presented thereby, including each of the following risks:

- *Market or Interest Rate Risk*: The risk that rates, or the spreads between rates, will increase or decrease, and the effect of such changes on the Swap Transaction's cash flow and market value.
- *Basis Risk*: The mismatch between the rate received by the Issuer under a Swap Transaction and the rate payable by the Issuer on any related obligation. For example, the risk in a floating-to-fixed swap that the floating rate received by the issuer under the Swap Transaction may not at all times equal the floating rate paid by the Issuer on the variable rate bonds that it is hedging.
- *Tax Risk*: Basis risk stemming from changes in the value or interest cost of the Issuer's tax-exempt bonds, as a result of the occurrence of tax events in respect of the Issuer's bonds or of tax-exempt bonds generally, including changes in marginal income tax rates and other changes in the Federal and state tax systems.
- *Termination Risk*: The risk that a Swap Transaction could be terminated prior to its scheduled termination date pursuant to its terms as a result of any of several events relating to either the Issuer or its counterparty. Upon an early termination, the Issuer could owe a termination payment to the counterparty or receive a termination payment from the counterparty. Such payment would typically reflect the then-current market value of all Swap Transactions executed by the Issuer and its counterparty.

- *Amortization Risk:* The risk of a mismatch between the principal amount of any obligations related to the Swap Transaction and the notional amount of the Swap Transaction.
- *Counterparty Risk:* The risk that the counterparty will not fulfill its obligations as specified by the terms of the Swap Transaction.
- *Rollover Risk:* The risk that the term of a Swap Transaction does not match the term of the related bonds being hedged.
- *Uncommitted Funding/Put Risk:* Derivative transactions that entail the use of Variable Rate Demand Obligations (VRDOs) bear the risks of the VRDOs, including the risk that the bonds cannot be remarketed and/or liquidity facility cannot be renewed.

## 5. Additional Considerations

The Issuer shall note each of the following additional considerations:

- *Accounting & Covenants:* The Issuer shall consider how the execution and performance of a Swap Transaction will be reported for accounting purposes and how the terms of the Swap Transaction may affect satisfaction by the Issuer of its financial covenants.
- *Security:* The Issuer understands that its procurement and negotiation of the optimum portfolio of Swap Transactions in accordance with the terms of this Policy may be dependent, in part, on its ability to secure its payments to its counterparties. The Issuer shall consider, in light of its overall debt and investment management policy, and consistent with any limitations imposed by its other credit agreements, the benefits of providing its counterparties with a favorable credit position vis-à-vis its other creditors (e.g., parity with bondholders, etc.). Additionally, the Issuer may provide additional credit enhancement to its counterparties in the form of collateral, financial guaranty insurance or other credit support.

## 6. Risk Limits

The total notional amount and term of all Swap Transactions executed by the Issuer shall not exceed the notional amount and term specified from time to time by the Board for Swap Transactions.

It is expected that the Issuer's total variable rate exposure, net of Swap Transactions which have the economic effect of reducing (or increasing) variable rate exposure, shall not exceed an amount to be determined by the Board from time to time. This range incorporates the Issuer's asset-liability analysis and will be reviewed and adjusted as investment allocations, risk tolerance, credit strength, market conditions and other factors evolve.

## 7. Procurement

All services related to Swap Products shall be procured in a manner which is intended to provide the Issuer with the highest level of service at the best available terms and pricing while being consistent with any applicable laws.

## 8. Swap Counterparties

While the Issuer shall have a flexible credit standard, it shall seek to enter into Swap Transactions with counterparties rated in the "A" category or above as of the date of execution of the Swap Transaction as is currently required under Tennessee Code Annotated ("TCA").

For lower-rated (below "A" category) counterparties, the Issuer shall seek credit enhancement in the form of collateral or additional guarantees, as appropriate. The Issuer shall seek to include terms in Swap Transactions to mitigate and offset its exposure to counterparty risk, including, without limiting the forgoing, ratings-based termination events.

## 9. Execution and Ongoing Management

The County Executive and Finance Director shall have discretion to negotiate Swap Transactions consistent with this Policy with further Board of County Commissioner action, and consistent with any applicable resolution of the Board. This discretion shall extend to future termination or modifications of the initial Swap Transactions provided the resulting structure does not exceed the parameters set forth in this Policy or prescribed by the Board.

The Issuer shall seek to maximize the benefits it accrues and manage the risks it bears by actively managing its use of Swap Products. This shall entail continuous monitoring of market conditions, in conjunction with the counterparty and the Issuer's advisors, for emergent opportunities and risks. The Authorized Officer(s) is/are authorized to manage existing Swap Transactions without additional Board approval. Ongoing management may entail modifications of existing positions including:

- Early termination of a Swap Transaction;
- Modification of the duration of a Swap Transaction;
- A sale or purchase of options; and
- Application of basis swaps; and
- Amendments to confirmations to renegotiate certain terms and conditions.

Each proposed modification shall be consistent with this Policy.

## 10. Swap Documentation

The Issuer shall use, where practicable, standard ISDA documentation, including the ISDA Master Agreement, the Schedule to the ISDA Master Agreement, a Confirmation of each Swap Transaction and, as applicable, the ISDA Credit Support Annex. The Issuer shall consider the following when negotiating the documentation of a particular Swap Transaction:

- Liquidity should be maximized. Key provisions, including those related to early termination and collateral requirements should reflect the credit strength of the parties to the Swap Transaction, and, as far as practicable, market conventions.
- Eligible collateral under a Credit Support Annex shall be defined by current market standards. If the swap is uninsured, collateral thresholds shall be set on a sliding scale based on credit ratings.

#### 11. Reporting and Disclosure

The County Executive and the Finance Director shall prepare periodic reports on the status of its Swap Transactions. Each report shall include an evaluation of the performance of each Swap Transaction relative to the Issuer's goals, and other performance and risk measures. Each report shall include a summary of the terms of each Swap Transaction, including the credit rating of the counterparty, the value of any collateral that has been posted, the market value of the Swap Transaction, as well as cumulative and periodic cash flows. Each report shall note all material changes to existing Swap Transactions and any new Swap Transactions entered into by the Issuer since the previous report.

The County Executive and the Finance Director shall ensure compliance with this Policy as well as prevailing accounting practices and federal, state, and local regulations and requirements. Disclosure shall be provided to rating agencies<sup>1</sup> as needed.

### 5.8 Transparency

#### 1. Capital Outlay Notes and Tax Anticipation Notes.

*For those notes which are included in the normal budget process, the budget public hearing and public meeting notice will satisfy all notification requirements.*

#### 2. General Obligation Bonds and Revenue Bonds

*For bond issues, a separate public notice will be run in the newspaper of record notifying the citizens of the proposed debt. A public hearing will be held prior to the commission meeting when such debt will be voted upon.*

#### 3. The Commission will be provided a completed copy of state form CT-0253 listing the cost of issuance of debt prior to passage.

### 5.9 Hiring Professionals / Potential conflicts of interest

White County shall from time to time hire legal counsel, a financial advisor or underwriter to assist in issuance of debt. The county will follow these procedures:

*Legal Counsel – The County shall enter into an engagement letter agreement with each lawyer or law firm representing the county in a debt transaction.*

*Financial Advisor – the County shall enter into a written agreement with each person or firm serving as financial advisor in debt management and transactions. If the County chooses to hire financial advisors, the County must select between the following options:*

*In a competitive sale, the financial advisor (either):*

*Shall not be permitted to bid on an issue for which they are or have been providing advisory services;*

*Or*

*May bid on an issue for which they are providing advisory services only if (i) the governing body or designated official grants in writing specific authority on a transaction by transaction basis, (ii) such sale is properly carried out through a widely and publicly advertised sale, during normal bond sale hours, and through an industry standard, electronic bidding platform not requiring verification by the financial advisor, and (iii) the financial advisor fee is separately disclosed and billed from the underwriting fee.*

*In a publicly offered, negotiated sale, the financial advisor (either):*

*Shall not be permitted to resign as financial advisor in order to underwrite an issue for which they are or have been providing advisory services;*

*Or*

*May resign as financial advisor in advance of negotiations in order to underwrite an issue for which they are or have been providing advisory services.*

*Underwriter – The underwriter in a publicly offered, negotiated sale shall be required to provide pricing information both as to interest rates and to takedown per maturity to the governing body (or its designated official) in advance of the pricing of the debt.*


#### *Conflicts*

*Professionals involved in a debt transaction hired or compensated by the County shall be required to disclose to the County existing client and business relationships between and among the professionals to a transaction (including but not limited to financial advisor, swap advisor, bond counsel, swap counsel, trustee, paying agent, underwriter,*

counterparty, and remarketing agent), as well as conduit issuers, sponsoring organizations and program administrators. This disclosure shall include that information reasonably sufficient to allow the County to appreciate the significance of the relationships.

Professionals who become involved in the debt transaction as a result of a bid submitted in a widely and publicly advertised competitive sale conducted using an industry standard, electronic bidding platform are not subject to this disclosure. No disclosure is required that would violate any rule or regulation of professional conduct.

#### RESOLUTION FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION IN THE ELECTRONIC MONITORING INDIGENCY FUND

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Chapter 505 of the 2019 Public Acts, a local government shall have the option to participate in the Electronic Monitoring Indigency Fund (“EMIF”) relative to the payment of costs for eligible transdermal monitoring devices, other alternative drug and alcohol monitoring devices, and global positioning monitoring devices for its indigent defendants (collectively, “Devices”). Participation shall be demonstrated through a resolution legally adopted and approved by the White County legislative body accepting the liability associated with participation and containing the budgeted amount that the White County Legislative Body commits to its participation in the EMIF;

**WHEREAS**, White County Government, “Local Government” desires to participate in the EMIF relative to the payment of costs associated with Devices until such time as the Local Government withdraws its participation in the EMIF.

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government agrees that in order to participate in the EMIF for the payment of costs associated with Devices, it shall adopt this resolution containing a budgeted amount for the upcoming fiscal year and sign a memorandum of understanding with the State of Tennessee about the payment of costs;

**WHEREAS**, through the memorandum of understanding between the White County Government and the State, the State may bill the local government for its budgeted amount by drawing from either the Local Government’s Local Government Investment Pool (“LGIP”) account or from a bank account designated by the Local Government for costs associated with Devices;

**WHEREAS**, the State may also obtain money from participating Local Governments for costs associated with Devices from the Local Government’s state-shared taxes;

**WHEREAS**, through the Local Government’s participation and for the duration of its participation period, the Local Government will be responsible for fifty percent (50%) of the cost associated with Devices that have been ordered on or after July 1, 2019;

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government understands through the execution of this document that the State will provide funds matching each Local Government’s budgeted amount for participation in the fund,

subject to an appropriation by the State and the solvency of either or both of the accounts contained in the EMIF;

**WHEREAS**, for each upcoming fiscal year, the Local Government agrees that it will work cooperatively with the State to develop its budgeted amount for participation in the fund prior to approval by the Local Government's legislative body to determine if the State anticipates having sufficient funds to provide its fifty percent (50%) match;

**WHEREAS**, for each year of participation subsequent to the Local Government's initial participation year, and no later than a date certain established by the State Treasurer, the Local Government shall notify the State Treasurer of the budgeted amount that is approved for its continued participation in the EMIF within thirty (30) days after the Local Government budget is approved by the local legislative body along with a copy of the approved budget; said budgeted amount shall appropriate the funds necessary for the Local Government to meet its liabilities;

**WHEREAS**, to the extent that the Local Government does not pay its costs associated with Devices, the State will cease paying its portion of the costs, and the State will not approve any claims or pay any invoices on a going forward basis until such time that the Local Government has sufficient funds;

**WHEREAS**, subject to applicable rules, policies, procedures and guidance from the State, a Local Government may amend its budget by reducing and not increasing its budgeted amount;

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government shall be solely responsible for its liability in its EMIF participation as indicated in applicable laws, rules, this resolution and memorandum of understanding; and

**WHEREAS**, should a Local Government withdraw its participation from the EMIF, the Local Government shall pay outstanding liabilities for Device invoices for claims that were approved during the period of time the Local Government participated in EMIF.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the White County Legislative Body hereby authorizes the Local Government participation in EMIF with the Local Government being solely responsible for meeting the requirements, conditions, limitations and restrictions relative to the payment of its liabilities associated with participation in the EMIF. The White County Legislative Body has also adopted a budget appropriating the funds necessary to meet the Local Government's liabilities associated with its participation in EMIF and has committed a budgeted amount of \$28,800 that will be used to fund its participation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019.

### RESOLUTION NO. 56-09-2019

### RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE FUNDING FORMULA OF THE WHITE COUNTY WHEEL TAX AS ADOPTED AUGUST 1, 2013

**WHEREAS**, the White County legislative body did pass a resolution on June 17, 2013 calling for a special election on the question of implementing a White County wheel tax in the amount of \$42.00 for each motor driven vehicle; and,

**WHEREAS**, the White County citizenry did approve the resolution as passed by the White County legislative body on June 17, 2013 in a special election held on August 1, 2013; and,

**WHEREAS**, the resolution as passed and approved did specify that the original funding formula used to allocate wheel tax revenues among the various funds could be changed upon the passage of a formal resolution to this effect by the White County legislative body.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the White County legislative body that:

**SECTION 1.** The proceeds of the motor vehicle privilege tax levied by the approval of the White County citizenry in the special election held on August 1, 2013, which are collected during the period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 shall be placed into the following funds as follows: 76% General Purpose School Fund, 18% Highway/Public Works Fund, and 6% County General Fund.

**SECTION 2.** The proceeds of the motor vehicle privilege tax levied by the approval of the White county citizenry in the special election held on August 1, 2013, which are collected beginning on July 1, 2020 and thereafter shall be placed into the following funds as follows: 50% General Purpose School Fund, 7% Highway/Public Works Fund, and 43% County General Fund.

**SECTION 3.** The funding formulas as specified in this resolution shall take precedence over any previously adopted wheel tax funding formulas, and any previously adopted wheel tax funding formulas shall hereby be repealed upon the passage of this resolution.

**SECTION 3.** This funding formula may be altered again, as needed, by the passage of a formal resolution to this effect by the White County legislative body.

**SECTION 4.** If any provision of this resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this resolution or the original

White County wheel tax resolution which can be given effect with the invalid provision or application, and to that end the provisions of this resolution are declared to be severable.


