The White County Steering Committee A met on Monday, March 2, 2020, at the White County Courthouse. **Members of Committee A include Commissioners Stanley Neal, Chairman, Roger Mason, Vice Chairman, Andy Haston, Secretary, T.K. Austin, Dakota White, Robert McCormick and Dale Bennett.**

Chairman Neal called the meeting to order and requested roll call. All members were present. There being a quorum, the meeting continued with opening prayer led by Commissioner White.

Also present were citizens of White County –Shawna Kirby, Bobby Moon, David Lee, Danny Eldridge, Jessie Wilburn Mr. & Mrs. Lonnie Slatten, Debra McIntyre, Mr. Jefferies and others not identified by name. Also present were Commissioner Dale Bennet, Lisa Luck, UCDD, Kurt Heitschmidt, Regional Health Dept., Chad Marcum, Gaylen Barlow.

### **Order of Business:**

Chairman Neal asked for review and approval of the Minutes from the previous meeting. Commissioner White made a motion and Commissioner McCormick seconded the motion to approve the Minutes as presented. With no objections the motion was approved.

**Parks & Recreation - Sub-Committee Update** – Commissioner Mason stated that there were no updates since last month's meeting. The P&R will be meeting Thursday, March 5<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm.

**Library – Update-** Commissioner Mason stated there were no updates since last month's meeting.

**Census 2020 – Complete Count Committee Update** – Kim England, Executive Assistant updated members stating that the grant submitted to promote participation and awareness of the upcoming Census count has been approved. The official contract with the amount awarded not yet announced. Funding will be released April 1, 2020 and contract ends June 30, 2020.

**Building Permits Update** – Kim England, Executive Assistant announced that the final contract approving White County Government (Executive Office) to be an Issuing Agent has been approved and received from the State of TN Dept. of Insurance and Commerce. Training has

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been completed and Residential and Electrical permits only will now be available at the White Co. Executive Office.

**District 7 – Dew Rd. Speed Limit Recommendation-** Commissioner Bobby McCulley not present. Discussion was tabled.

### **Old Business**

Commissioner Mason updated guests on the ongoing nuisance complaints regarding a property located in the Walling area. Mason explained the efforts of the Commission to adopt a county Powers Act to enforce property maintenance and establish property codes. Residents of the area spoke about the environmental and safety concerns about the specific property. Mason further noted that Tn Dept of Environmental had visited the property and are addressing the issues and will be responsible for enforcement from their findings.

Another citizen from the Gum Springs Mtn. area expressed concerns of properties in that area that are becoming “dumping sites”.

Commissioner T.K. Austin updated members and guests on the efforts to pass a County Powers Act to address and enforce codes within the county. HSE Sub-committee plans to finalize a draft of the recommended Powers Act in the upcoming weeks and present the draft to Steering A for consideration.

Mr. Jefferies, citizen, addressed the committee about concerns in his residential area on Itowia Rd. Mr. Jefferies presented pictures and noted that the road is narrow and unsafe for 2-way traffic. Mr. Jefferies requested that the Itowia Rd be changed to a 1-way road, additional signage posted, and the curve be widened. Chairman Neal recommended that he (Mr. Jefferies) speak with Road Superintendent, Clay Parker about the concerns and Neal agreed to discuss possible solution or options with Mr. Parker as well.

Ghuse Rd – Discussion on adopting Ghuse Rd. as a county road was tabled last month, pending discussion with Road Superintendent, Clay Parker about paving the road if adopted. Chairman Neal updated members stating that Mr. Parker denied the request to pave Ghuse Rd. No further discussion or action taken.

Commissioner Mason discussed his concerns about the few roads within the county that have not been adopted as official county roads and what appears to have been an oversight when 911 assigned roads in the early 90s. Mason asked that a list be compiled with possible roads in each district that may have been overlooked during the same timeframe. He suggested that these roads be adopted by the county. Mason further stated that with the Planning Commission in place now,

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future roads should not be overlooked like it appears happened with Center Point Lane and Dow Creek Loop. Discussion tabled with no action taken.

### New Business:

Ms. Shawna Kirby, resident on Spur Rd received a letter regarding the proposed name change of Spur Rd. to Lamb-Bohannon Rd. Ms. Kirby is one of four (4) residents on Spur Rd. and she stated her strong opposition to re-naming Spur Rd. No further discussion and no action taken.

Kurt Hisenschmidt with Regional Health Dept. discussed an upcoming grant opportunity through the TN Dept. of Health to promote healthy lifestyle changes and promote wellness and physical activity for communities. Hisenschmidt stated that the Healthy Build Community Environment grant is a competitive grant that could award up to \$85 thousand dollars with no match to assist with planning, designing or engineering of new facilities or improving existing parks, tracks, greenways, etc.

With no other announcements or business, Chairman Neal noted that the White Co. Legislative Body will meet in regular session on Monday, March 16<sup>th</sup> at 6pm.

The next Steering Committee A meeting will be Monday, April 6, at 5:30 pm.

The White County Solid Waste committee met on Monday, March 2, 2020, at the White County Courthouse. **Members of Solid Waste Committee are Commissioners Roger Mason, Chairman, Dakota White, Vice Chairman, Andy Haston, Secretary, Stanley Neal, Robert McCormick, T.K. Austin and Dale Bennett.**

Chairman Mason requested roll call. All members of present, absent was Denny Wayne Robinson, County Executive. There being a quorum, the meeting was called to order.

Also present were citizens of White County –Also present were Commissioner Cain Rogers, Lisa Luck, UCDD, Chad Marcum, Gaylen Barlow, Solid Waste Director.

### **Order of Business:**

Chairman Mason asked for review and approval of the Minutes from the previous meeting. Commissioner White made a motion and Commissioner McCormick seconded the motion to approve the Minutes as presented. With no objections the motion was approved.

**Directors Report** – Barlow stated that surveying of the new cell at the WC Landfill is set to begin Wednesday of next week. Commissioner Mason reported that he was pleased with his recent visit to the landfill stating that the addition of staff has been beneficial to the overall operation.

Barlow stated that the amount of trash and tires coming in has increased. Barlow noted 128 tons come into the landfill today. Barlow stated that there has been an increasing number of residents who have come to the landfill to dispose of tires but refused to pay noting that they are returning the tires to the Convenience Centers. Barlow stated that 344 tires have come in from the landfill since Jan 1, 2020. After brief discussion, Commissioner Neal made a motion, seconded by Bennett to exclude tires from being disposed of at the Convenience Centers effective April 1, 2020. Upon a voice call, all members voted yay, none opposed.

**Engineers Report** - with the absence of Executive Robinson, the Engineers Report was tabled.

**APR (Annual Progress Report-** Commissioner Mason opened the floor to Ms. Lisa Luck with UCDD. Ms. Luck presented a draft of the required APR noting that the report did not included solid waste / recycling report from THK Rhythm. Ms. Luck explained the requirements of the APR and the 10-year plan to reduce waste in White County. Ms. Luck continues to assist with recycling

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options. Ms. Luck concluded with a brief explanation of possible grants that she may assist with in the future. Ms. Luck noted that she had met with Executive Robinson to discuss the country's needs to reduce waste and recycle more plastic and aluminum cans. According to the 10-year plan, the goal is a 25% reduction of waste going into the landfill.

After brief discussion, Commissioner Neal made a motion to approve the APR contingent upon THK Rhythms, (or any others) submission of their report prior to March 31st, seconded by Commissioner McCormick. With none opposed, the motion was approved.

Mr. Rogers opened the floor for nominations for Chairman. Mr. Mason nominated Mr. Neal. Ms. O'Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion that all nominations cease and Mr. Neal be elected by acclamation. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum reviewed the fiscal year 2019 audit results with the committee. The committee reviewed the four audit finding of White County at length.

The committee considered the submission of a formal report letter to the White County Commission regarding the fiscal year 2019 audit report. The committee discussed wording of the report letter, specifically surrounding finding numbers 2019-003 and 2019-004 regarding operations of certain offices being under review by the Comptroller's Office. After discussion, Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to draft a letter stating the committee's concurrence with findings 2019-001 and 2019-002 as well as their intent to monitor of the results from findings 2019-003 and 2019-004. The committee will request that the full commission spread the report letter on the minutes during their March 2020 meeting. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee reviewed the Fraud Reporting Process and signage for White County which was established in December of 2014. It was discussed that a hotline phone number, which would allow for a message to be left that would be automatically disseminated to the committee, could provide for cost savings while being more consistent with the Comptroller's method for reporting fraud via the "Fraud Reporting Hotline." Switching to this method would eliminate the need for a separate email address and post office box. Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Mason seconded the motion to establish a hotline phone number as the method of reporting fraud, waste, and abuse within White County. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The White County Audit Committee met on February 27, 2020 to review the independent auditor's report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2019. The report detailed four findings for the fiscal year. The committee discussed the findings at length and ways in which the findings could be corrected in the future.

The committee reports that it concurs with the following audit findings detailed in the independent auditor's report:

Finding 2019-001: Office of Finance Director – The Solid Waste Disposal Fund had a deficit in unrestricted net position at June 30, 2019.

Finding 2019-002: Office of County Clerk – The office did not review its software audit logs.

The committee reports that it will monitor and provide a supplemental report on the following audit findings detailed in the independent auditor's report when more information is available:

Finding 2019-003: Office of County Clerk – Operations of the County Clerk's Office are currently being reviewed.

Finding 2019-004: Office of Sheriff – Operations of the Sheriff's Office are currently being reviewed.

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## **Budget Committee Meeting**

Date: 03/02/2020

Time: Following Solid Waste Committee

Location: White County Courthouse

The White County Budget Committee met on Monday, March 2, 2020 following the Solid Waste Committee meeting at the White County Courthouse. Members present were Mr. Roger Mason, Mr. Stanley Neal, Mr. Andy Haston, and Mr. Cain Rogers. Also present were Mr. Chad Marcum and Mr. Robert McCormick. Absent was Mr. Denny Wayne Robinson.

There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order by Mr. Mason.

Mr. Mason asked for approval of the minutes from the February 3, 2020 meeting. Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the minutes as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a General Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$39,080 to correct a February 2020 amendment which reallocated funds from the State of Tennessee Department of Health contractual appropriation to the General Capital Projects Fund. The state determined that White County would not be allowed to "hold back" two consecutive years of contractual appropriations as previously indicated for the health department addition. This amendment re-appropriates the full \$39,080 to the contract while also allocating an additional \$15,000 to the General Capital Projects Fund. Mr. Rogers made a motion and Mr. Neal seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a Highway/Public Works Fund budget amendment in the amount of \$28,000 to recognize revenue from the sale of surplus equipment to be used for the construction of a shed behind the Central Maintenance facility. Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Rogers seconded the motion to approve the amendment as presented and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered five (5) School Federal Projects Fund budget amendments as follows:

1. Subfund 201 – Title II, Part A for substitute teachers and Praxis fees
2. Subfund 411 – Title IV, Part A for middle school bus trips for career exploration
3. Subfund 901 – IDEA, Part B for the purchase of additional car seats for SPED busses
4. Subfund 431 – 21<sup>st</sup> Century for educational assistant salaries and supplies
5. Subfund 432 – 21<sup>st</sup> Century for educational assistant salaries

Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the budget amendments as presented. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

The committee considered a request from the Biz Foundry to appropriate an additional \$5,000 to assist with the startup of their Sparta location at 21 North Main Street. Mr. Marcum expressed Mr. Robinson's support for this additional non-profit appropriation, indicating that it will provide a favorable return on the

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county's investment. After discussion, Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Haston seconded the motion to approve the additional non-profit appropriation request, amend the budget accordingly, and recommend its passage by the full county commission. On a voice vote, the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Marcum updated the committee on the Fiscal Year 2021 property tax penny projections. Current estimates show that the penny will increase by approximately \$8,500 to \$51,500. The committee took the information under advisement for use in the upcoming budget process.

Mr. Mason asked the committee for any old business: There was none.

Mr. Mason asked the committee for any new business:

Mr. Neal provided the committee with budgetary information to consider for establishing a paid, county-wide fire department to supplement our existing volunteer departments. Mr. Neal expressed his feeling regarding the need for this due to the continual volunteer firefighter shortage as well as the growth in population, residential structures, and industrial structures seen in the county. The committee discussed the proposal at length as well as the need to seek the full commission's input prior to making any budgetary decisions on the matter. After discussion, Mr. Neal made a motion and Mr. Rogers seconded the motion to send the proposal to Steering Committee B for consideration. On a voice vote, the motion as unanimously approved.

We continue to move state inmates to prison when beds become available and have sent several to prison or other county jails for housing. We have sent 5 inmates to Bledsoe County Correctional Complex this month. We have emailed Mr. Creech about moving more state inmates to the prison but we know that this takes time. The single female state inmate has made parole and should be released soon. Our commissioners are setting lower bonds on certain charges to bond people sooner. We currently have 1 person out on the "Home Detention Program. The ankle monitoring program that was started by the judge and the judicial commissioners has been suspended. This will not immediately solve the overcrowding issue; but this combined with current things being done it may help relieve the pressure and overcrowding in time. As always, we would appreciate any help that TCI and the State can offer.

They were hoping to accept waste at a transfer station for counties wanting to use the waste-to-energy facility in Van Buren but after three years of planning this facility still has not broken ground. They are not considering building a recycle center. They would like to recycle through Cumberland County in 2020.

White County seeks to recycle as many materials as they can from their Class I Landfill. They transported cardboard to Van Buren County for recycling for a portion of 2019. Van Buren stopped accepting cardboard and plastic from White County so they have been unable to recycle much in 2019. White County recently talked to Cumberland County about accepting their recyclables including cardboard, aluminum cans (they don't collect these yet), and plastic. They have been looking for recycling options for plastics because residents really want to recycle plastics and other materials. Ecycler charges to recycle White County's electronics. Global Recycling now picks up some of their electronics from the convenience center and recycles them. Global only pick up the electronics they can utilize -- not all of them.
